The first of these 24 hours light  
winds from NE and rain steering  
by E & saw a sail the  
middle light winds from E and  
rain heading SE the latter  
strong breeze from E & heading  
SE a sail in sight Lat Long

Tuesday Dec the 2 1845  
The first of these 24 hours light  
winds from E & heading SE the middle  
light winds from NE & steering E  
by S the latter light winds from  
Westering E by S at 4 past 4 A.M.  
Lat by an observed altitude of  
the Polar star 16-48 saw a  
sail Lat by 6-16-57 Long 10-50

Wednesday Dec the 3 1845  
These 24 hours light winds from  
NW 10-41 steering East the water  
turning in the topmost rigging fine  
weather Lat 16-02 Long

Thursday Dec the 4 1845  
The first of these 24 hours light winds  
from NW 10-41 steering E by S the  
middle and latter calm the water  
to work on the topmost rigging

Friday Dec the 5 1845

These 24 hours calm and fine  
weather the water to work on  
the rigging Lat 15-51 Long

Saturday Dec the 6 1845  
These 24 hours light winds from  
the Eastward heading to the South  
the latter we lowered a boat  
and went to a log of wood  
to catch fish we caught several fish  
and took in the Lat 15-56 Long

Sunday Dec the 7 1845  
These 24 hours light winds from NW  
steering SE saw finbacks  
Lat 15-58 Long 10-40

Monday Dec the 8 1845  
The first of these 24 hours light  
winds from NW by E steering SE  
the middle and latter strong  
winds from E by N heading SE  
by S

Lat 11-53 Long  
Tuesday Dec the 9 1845  
The first of these 24 hours light  
winds from E by S heading SE the middle  
light winds and squalls the  
latter light winds heading  
SE by S we unhooked the fly  
gibb to mend

Lat 12-18 Long  
Wednesday Dec the 10 1845  
These 24 hours light wind from  
the Eastward steering to the South  
we caught 2 porpoises the water  
heading the fly gibb saw  
finbacks

E and rain squalls saw porpoises  
Lat 5-20

Tuesday Dec the 23 1845  
These 24 hours light winds from

The first of these 24 hours heading  
to the middle light winds  
from SE heading SE the latter  
light winds from SE heading  
SE

Lat 5-10 Long 10-0-57  
Thursday Dec the 25 1845  
These 24 hours light winds from  
the Southward and Eastward heading  
from East to East East seeing  
squalls Lat 5-25 Long 9-8-12

Friday Dec the 26 1845  
These 24 hours light winds from  
the South heading to the Eastward  
the middle rain saw porpoises  
Lat 5-51 Long

Saturday Dec the 27 1845  
These 24 hours light winds from the  
SE steering to the Eastward  
Lat 5-50 Long 9-50-55

Sunday Dec the 28 1845  
These 24 hours light winds from  
by E heading East saw nothing

These 24 hours light winds from  
the Southward and Eastward heading
