

Remarks On Board Ship Hobbsman
Tuesday Dec the 30th 1845

There 24 hours light wind from the south heading to the Eastward the first part we anchored the main topsail and maintopgallant sail and bent others the latter anchored the mainsail to mend

Lat 2-51 Long 91-59

Wednesday Dec the 31st 1845

The first of these 24 hours light wind from ESE heading S by W we bent the mainsail the middle light wind the latter light breeze at 6 AM we saw Calappa Island bearing South rounding sails

Lat 2-05 Long 92-18

Thursday Jan the 1st 1846

The first of these 24 hours light wind from ESE heading S by W we bent a new fore sail and lowered a boat and caught a Diamond fish Calappa. Sled and then mass in sight the middle and latter light airs and calms Calappa in sight

Lat 2-07 Long

Friday Jan the 2nd 1846

The first of these 24 hours calm the middle light wind from SSE heading East the latter calm we went down the fore topgallant mast the Island in sight

Lat 2-02 Long

Saturday Jan the 3rd 1846

The first of these 24 hours calm we went up the fore topgallant mast the middle and latter light wind from SSE heading East Lat 1-59 Long 91-19

Falmouth Portland Long Martin
Saturday Jan the 1st 1846

The first part of these 24 hours light wind we saw a carcass we spoke the ship N.E. of N.E.S. 45 miles out 300 lbs 1 ship and a Burques in sight the middle and latter light wind standing up and on to be bay 4 sail in sight Lat 10 miles South

Sunday Jan the 1st 1846

The first of these 24 hours light wind from ESE the middle calm the latter light air at 7 AM we saw the Burque heading of W and the Boy of Wito with boats lower at 8 AM the Burques boats struck a whale and the other boats chased another whale the Burque Indian of London gave chase at 11 we lowered at 11 AM the bow boat to the whale Lat 2-00 South the Burque head of Hobbsman Lat 2-50

Monday Jan the 2nd 1846

The first of these 24 hours light wind at 6 minutes of one we took the whale a long side and commenced calling at 7 PM we divided we spoke the Boy and then the Burque was 25 miles out with 1000 lbs whale and 500 sperm the Burque being 28 miles 1000 sperm the latter we commenced clearing away the lead and bailing at 8 AM saw a school of whales and hauled at 11 returned without carcass or whale going quick
