

Remarks On Board Ship Hobomack

Tuesday Nov the 24th 1846

The first of these 24 hours light
winds the watches boiling blackfish
at 4 P.M. we hoisted for blackfish
the middle light wind the latter
light wind at 9 P.M. we saw
whales and heard the Bow and
Starboard astern and down

Wednesday Nov the 25th 1846

The first of these 24 hours calm
the Starboard and bow boat each
saw a whale at 6 P.M. we took
the bow boats which along with
at 12 took the 2 Boats the
latter  light
wind we cut in the whale

Thursday Nov the 26th 1846

The first of these 24 hours light
winds from S by E heading to the bow
stern we commenced boiling the
middle light wind heading E. S. E.
the latter calm the watches boiling

The first of these 24 hours light
the middle calm and rain we finished
boiling the latter light
wind from the bow and stern
to the watch Lat 52 40 Long 87 17

Saturday Nov the 28th 1846

The first of these 24 hours light
wind heading to the North at
6 P.M. took and heading S. E. the
latter we backed to the S. E.

S. E. heading East

The first of these 24 hours

middle and latter  
light winds we cut in the whale
and stood to the N. E. W.

These 24 hours light winds from
S by W heading S. E. we commenced

finished boiling the latter
light winds from S. E. heading
to the S. W. Lat 52 40 Long 87 17

The first of these 24 hours light
winds from S. E. heading S. E.
we caught a turtle at 8 P.M.
we spoke the Gloucester of
Sag Harbor 2 1/2 miles out 1200 lbs
whale and we spoke the middle
and latter light winds from
South steering S. E.
