

Remarks On Board Ship Hoboken

Sunday June the 4th 1846

There 24 hours light airs and calm
steering N.W. we hove to and caught
a sunfish the land is sight

Lat 19-30 Long 70-30

Monday June the 5th 1846

There 24 hours light wind from
the South steering to the North the
latter we unburst the gills to
wind and lowered for blackfish
but got none Lat 18-20 Long 70-30

Tuesday June the 6th 1846

There 24 hours light breeze from
the South steering to the North the
latter we took a boat from our
head to wind Lat 18-30 Long 70-30

Wednesday June the 7th 1846

The first of these 24 hours calm
we lowered 2 boats for finbacks
and 1 for swordfish but got
none the middle and latter light
winds from S.E. steering to the
N.W. employed in swordfishing
we struck 4 and saved 2 the
Land 15 mi Lat 17-30 Long 70-30

Thursday June the 8th 1846

The first and middle of these 24
hours calm the latter light wind
we lowered 2 boats and got 2
swordfish the land is off
abundant weather at about 17-40

Friday June the 9th 1846

The first of these 24 hours calm
we lowered 3 boats for blackfish
and swordfish we got 1 swordfish
and the Bow Boat got 1
blackfish the latter light winds
saw finbacks Lat 17-25 Long 70-30

Saturday June the 10th 1846

The first and middle light winds
steering from S.E. steering
to the N.W. saw finbacks and
blackfish Lat 16-12 Long 70-30

Sunday June the 11th 1846

The first of these 24 hours strong
we should expect the opposite tending
to the S.W. the latter light winds
and greatly heading S.E. saw
finbacks Lat 16-20 Long 70-30

Monday June the 12th 1846

The first of these 24 hours strong
breeze the middle light wind the
latter light winds we saw a steam
boat hove up the coast at 11
A.M. we lowered for blackfish
saw finbacks Lat 16-26 Long 70-30

Tuesday June the 13th 1846

The first of these 24 hours the
boat returned the S. Boat got 1
swordfish the West 1st Boat
3 ~~blackfish~~

The middle light winds the latter light
winds the watches to work on black
fish Clabber at 9 A.M. we lowered
for blackfish and got 1 swordfish
and swordfish Lat 16-40 Long 70-30

Wednesday June the 14th 1846

There 24 hours strong winds steering
off and on shore boiling blackfish
saw finbacks

Lat 15-54 Long 70-30
