Friday Aug the 14th 1846

These 24 hours strong winds the latter-
oil steering to 10th Lat 10-15 S

Saturday Aug the 15th 1846

The first of these 24 hours light winds
heading E by S we commenced steering down
with the middle light winds the latter light
winds all hands employed in steering
heading West Lat 10-27 S

Sunday Aug the 16th 1846

The first of these 24 hours we finished
steering the middle and latter light
winds heading E by S saw porpoises
Lat 10-22 S Long 83-12 W

Monday Aug the 17th 1846

The first of these 24 hours light winds
heading E by S the middle and latter
strong breezes heading W by S Lat 10-25 S

Tuesday Aug the 18th 1846

The first and middle of these 24
hours strong winds heading W by S
the latter strong winds heading E
by S saw porpoises Lat 10-25 S

Wednesday Aug the 19th 1846

These 24 hours strong winds heading E by
S repairing the topwakes the latter
rattling down the main rigging Lat

Thursday Aug the 20th 1846

These 24 hours light winds and
with weather saw porpoises Lat

Friday Aug the 21st 1846

The first of these 24 hours light
winds heading W saw black fish the
middle and latter light winds heading
E by S Lat 10-25 S Long 84-49

From mouth of Roland St Jones. Most
Saturday Aug the 22nd 1846

These 24 hours light winds heading
E by S the middle strong Lat 10-40 S Long 85-45

Sunday Aug the 23rd 1846

The first of these 24 hours light winds
steering E the middle heading W by S the
latter steering to the Northward saw
ship Lat 15 S

Monday Aug the 24th 1846

The first of these 24 hours we spoke
the Porpoise of N York 21 miles out
400 Spruce whaler the middle
strong winds steering to the latter
steering West Lat 10-15 S Long 83-59

Tuesday Aug the 25th 1846

These 24 hours strong winds heading
E by S saw porpoises Lat 10-25 S

Wednesday Aug the 26th 1846

The first of these 24 hours light winds
steering to the middle and latter
strong winds heading W by S employed
in fitting new cutting black straps
Lat 10-25 S Long 85-51

Thursday Aug the 27th 1846

These 24 hours light winds heading
W by S saw porpoises and bore sharks
Lat 10-14 S Long 85-10

Friday Aug the 28th 1846

The first and middle light winds
heading W by S the latter we
saw the Phoenix of N York
21 miles out 1050 Spruce whaler
Lat 10-17 S

Saturday Aug the 29th 1846

These 24 hours fresh breezes heading
E by S the latter heading W by S
saw porpoises Lat 11 S saw
steering Lat 10-43 Long 86-15
