

Remarks On Board Ship "Hobbs" 4  
Sunday Aug the 30<sup>th</sup> 1846

The first of these 24 hours strong wind  
at 1 P.M. we hove to for the night  
at 3 the barbed and "Waist" boat  
struck at 5 took the bar board boat  
which a long side at 8 the waist returned  
they parted the line the latter we  
out in the water and stood to the windward  
word at 10 A.M. saw breaches



Lat 00 = 49 North

Monday Aug the 31<sup>st</sup> 1846

The first of these 24 hours we saw the  
whales a speaking and hove to at  
past 1 P.M. returned the bar board  
got a whale at 3 we commenced cutting  
at 6 finished and heading E & S the  
middle heading S & by E we commenced heading  
the latter light winds heading W & S  
saw breaches

Lat 00 = 49 North

Tuesday Sept the 1<sup>st</sup> 1846

The first of these 24 hours light winds  
heading W & by S the middle we finished  
heading the latter light winds heading E  
saw fin backs

Wednesday Sept the 2<sup>nd</sup> 1846

These 24 hours light wind and squall  
saw "porpoises"

Thursday Sept the 3<sup>rd</sup> 1846

These 24 hours light wind and squall  
the middle and latter heading to the  
westward saw a gail breaking out  
at 6 P.M.

Friday Sept the 4<sup>th</sup> 1846

The first of these 24 hours light wind  
heading W & S the middle and latter  
light winds heading E & S the latter  
commenced stowing down oil

Lat 00 = 50 North

Under the Poland Se Jones Master  
Saturday Sept the 5<sup>th</sup> 1846

The first of these 24 hours light winds  
we finished stowing down the middle  
and latter light winds heading E by S

Lat 00 = 12 South

Sunday Sept the 6<sup>th</sup> 1846  
These 24 hours light wind from S by E  
heading E by S

Lat 00 = 18 by 85 = 40

Monday Sept the 7<sup>th</sup> 1846  
These 24 hours light wind heading E by S  
I saw breaches and blackfish

Lat 00 = 20 by 84 = 24

Tuesday Sept the 8<sup>th</sup> 1846  
These 24 hours light winds heading  
to the Eastward the watches employed  
in ships duty saw a brig Lat

Wednesday Sept the 9<sup>th</sup> 1846  
The first and middle light winds  
heading to the Eastward the latter  
light winds spoke the size of  
SBE 23 mths out 600 sperm 100  
blackfish we saw breaches  
and ran off and saw nothing  
more a barge in sight Lat

Thursday Sept the 10<sup>th</sup> 1846  
The first of these 24 hours light  
winds we spoke the size and saw  
the barge George Porter of Nod sh  
hap 1400 66 the middle fresh  
breaches the latter light wind heading  
to the Northward Lat 00 = 12 by 82 = 40

Friday Sept the 11<sup>th</sup> 1846  
These 24 hours light winds heading  
W & by S

Saturday Sept the 12<sup>th</sup> 1846  
The first of these 24 hours light  
winds heading W & S the middle and  
latter light winds heading E & S Lat 00 = 11 North
