

Remarks On Board Ship *Watermark*
Sunday Sept the 13th 1846

The first of these 24 hours light winds
heading to the Eastward we lowered for
blackfish the L Boat & the Cow Boat
the middle and latter light winds
heading to the Eastward

Lat 00-07 S Long 81-51

Monday Sept the 14th 1846

The first of these 24 hours light winds
steering to the middle and latter light
winds steering to the Westward we killed
the blackfish we lowered for blackfish
got none

Lat 00-26 S Long 82-00

Tuesday Sept the 15th 1846

These 24 hours light winds from
heading West

Lat 00-42 S Long 82-00

Wednesday Sept the 16th 1846

The first of these 24 hours light winds
heading West the middle steered to the
Eastward the latter heading West saw
a ship which we called a merchant
man steering North employed
a tallow driving the main rigging
saw Pinbacks

Lat 00-45 S Long 82-50

Thursday Sept the 17th 1846

The first of these 24 hours light winds
heading West the middle heading East the
latter heading West I left the water
employed in ship's duty

Lat 00-16 S Long 83-00

Friday Sept the 18th 1846

The first of these 24 hours light
winds heading West the middle
heading to the Eastward the latter
heading West I saw
pinbacks

Lat 00-10 S Long 83-00

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Wilmington Robert P. Jones Master
Thursday Oct the 1st 1846

The first of these 24 hours we spent
the Highlander of Mystic 14 m the 300 lbs
from the middle and latter fine cruising
of weather bay saw 3 sail

Friday Oct the 2nd 1846

The first of these 24 hours fine weather
we spoke the Brig *Imyria* the
middle fine weather the latter light
winds steering to the Northward and
Eastward we unben't the fly gill
and put a new one and unben't the
main and main top gallant sails to
ward saw pinback

Lat 00-19 S Long 83-00

Saturday Oct the 3rd 1846

The first of these 24 hours we finished
making the top gallant sail and last
time the middle and latter fine weather
cruising of Redonda Rock

Lat 00-20 S Long 83-00

Sunday Oct the 4th 1846

The first of these 24 hours light winds
the L Boat went to the Rock for
fish but got none the middle and
latter light winds and fine weather
saw 3 sail Redonda Rock bearing West
8 m

Lat 00-16 S Long 83-00

Monday Oct the 5th 1846

The first and middle light winds and
fine weather steering to the Eastward
the latter light winds steering East
we unben't the fore top gallant sail to
ward of Brighton Is bearing East 10 m
Lat 00-10 S Long 83-00

Tuesday Oct the 6th 1846

The first of these 24 hours light winds
heading East the middle and latter light
winds heading East Biscaya Is in sight
Brighton bearing East 10 m
