

Remarks On Board Ship Hobomok

Thursday Nov the 5<sup>th</sup> 1846

The first of these 24 hours light winds the watches towing rigging the latter light winds washing Ship the Land  
Lat 10 ms Long 85-52 saw humpbacks

Friday Nov the 6<sup>th</sup> 1846

These 24 hours fresh beams working to windward saw humpbacks and 1 sail the land in sight Lat 8-56 Long

Saturday Nov the 7<sup>th</sup> 1846

These first of these 24 hours heading S by E at 6 PM took heading W by S the latter took ship and headed E by S saw 4 sails the Land in sight

Sunday Nov the 8<sup>th</sup> 1846

These 24 hours light winds employed in working to windward saw humpbacks and 2 sails the Land in sight Lat 4-29

Monday Nov the 9<sup>th</sup> 1846

The first of these 24 hours light winds at 4 PM we came to anchor in Fog to there was 5 or 6 ships and several barges and brigs lying to anchor here the latter 1 watch in liberty the other pointing ship

Tuesday Nov the 10<sup>th</sup> 1846

These 24 hours pointing ship and heading liberty the ship Elizabeth of water lying of and on in the out 400 fms  
what

Wednesday Nov the 11<sup>th</sup> 1846

These 24 hours pointing ship one watch in liberty 1 ship sailed

Thursday Nov the 12<sup>th</sup> 1846

These 24 hours one watch in liberty the other pointing 2 ships sailed

Friday Nov the 28<sup>th</sup> 1846

These 24 hours light winds steering N by E Lat 1-16 Long 84-08

Saturday Nov the 29<sup>th</sup> 1846

The first of these 24 hours steering N by E the middle lying A by E the latter steering to the Westward Lat Long 85-13

Sunday Nov the 30<sup>th</sup> 1846

These 24 hours fresh beams steering N by E Lat 10-17 Long 86-14

Monday Dec the 1<sup>st</sup> 1846

These 24 hours strong winds heading to the westward saw humpbacks pointing the Starboard Boat Lat 00-11 Long

Tuesday Dec the 2<sup>d</sup> 1846

These 24 hours light winds heading West pointing the Starboard Boat Lat 00-10 Long 85-25

Wednesday Dec the 3<sup>d</sup> 1846

These 24 hours light winds heading to the westward Lat 00-26 Long

Thursday Dec the 4<sup>th</sup> 1846

The first of these 24 hours light winds saw the Islands the middle five the latter two boats went ashore at Abington Is to look for turpin Lat 00-05 Long

Friday Dec the 5<sup>th</sup> 1846

The first of these 24 hours the boats returned with out a turpin plenty of fish the middle and latter light winds heading to the westward Lat

Saturday Dec the 6<sup>th</sup> 1846

These 24 hours light winds and then the latter steering to the Westward Lat 1-20 Long 84-50
