

Remarks On Board Ship Hoboken

Tuesday Feb the 16th 1847

The first of these 24 hours light winds heading S by E at 2 PM saw an Island bearing S by W dist 15 ms about 15 ms Long 98 and 170 W the middle and latter light winds steering S by E this is Caryforts Is. ^{rest all round} Lat 21=55 Long by Chr 157=42 ^{bracket two}

Wednesday Feb the 17th 1847

The first of these 24 hours light winds heading S at 2 PM saw Matildas Is bearing S by W dist about 15 ms at 4 PM bearing W dist 4 ms at 9 PM we shortened sail and laid with mainyard aback at 4 A.M. made sail and steering S some squalls Matildas Is. Lat 25=14 Long 138=15

Thursday Feb the 18th 1847

The first of these 24 hours strong winds heading S S W the middle strong winds and very squally with thunder and lightening the latter strong winds and squally we sent down the main top-sail yard Lat Long

Friday Feb the 19th 1847

The first of these 24 strong winds we sent up the yard the middle strong winds we hoisted reefed the fore and main top-sails the latter strong winds heading S by E Lat 27=20 Long

Saturday Feb the 20th 1847

These 24 hours strong winds from East heading S by E Lat 29=09 Long

Sunday Feb the 21st 1847

These 24 hours strong winds heading S by E Lat 30=55 Long 139=50

Monday Feb the 22nd 1847

These 24 hours strong winds from East heading S by E Lat 32=59 Long 139=40 ^{Long 141=35}

Two mouth Island Is. Jones, Master

Tuesday Feb the 23rd 1847

These 24 hours strong winds heading S by E Lat 34=41

Wednesday Feb the 24th 1847

These 24 hours light winds heading S by E Lat 36=00 Long

Thursday Feb the 25th 1847

The first of these 24 hours light winds heading S by E the middle light wind steering East the latter calm filling one of the bales-lays Lat 36=55 Long by Chr 158=15

Friday Feb the 26th 1847

These 24 hours light winds from W by N we reefed the masts and set up the latter we bent a main-royal Lat 36=58 Long

Saturday Feb the 27th 1847

The first of these 24 hours light winds from S by W steering East we unhooked the mainsail and bent a new one the middle light winds and calms the latter light airs from N by E heading S by E Lat 38=42 Long by Chr 155=50

Sunday Feb the 28th 1847

These 24 hours fine breeze from N by E steering S by E Lat 38=53 Long 157=40

Monday Mar the 1st 1847

The first of these 24 hours light winds from N by E steering East the middle and latter light winds from W by N steering S by E we broke out water

Tuesday 2nd Lat 38=00 Long

These 24 hours light winds steering S by E 10 miles calm and rain the latter strong wind from East heading S by E mending sails

Lat 38=51 Long 150=55
