

Remarks On Board Ship Habonaki

Thursday May the 6th 1847.

The first of these 24 hours howl
2 boats for humpbacks but did not
strike the middle laid with the
yards aback the latter heeling black.
I saw humpbacks and a barque fine
weather steering to the northward
Lat 20 55 off Lat 18-44 Long

Friday May the 7th 1847

The first of these 24 hours light wind
from S E steering to the northward
saw a barque and brig a going in to
Korea saw some vessels lying at anchor
we howl for humpbacks but did not
strike the middle light wind the latter
calm we howl for humpbacks
but did not strike the latter
caught a swordfish the land 15 ms

Saturday May the 8th 1847

These 24 hours light wind the first
and middle heading to the south the
latter steering to the northward
saw humpbacks Lat 18-18 Long 40 11

Sunday May the 9th 1847

These 24 hours light wind at 5 PM
we howl for blackfish at 6 returned
the latter howl for humpbacks at
10 AM returned without success
saw sail Lat 18-52 Long 10 11

Monday May the 10th 1847

The first of these 24 hours light
wind we saw the town of Ile the
latter light wind saw humpbacks
the land 20 ms Lat 19-55
standing up and on the land

Wednesday the 20th 1847

Thursday May the 21st 1847

The first of these 24 hours light wind
at 1 PM we spoke the Montano of
Porto Rico 21 miles out ^{at 15-0} ~~at 15-0~~ and
15-0. I saw and the James Lopez of St. Loe
the latter no sail I saw another ship the
middle light wind the latter light
wind steering to the N W saw 1
sail white and black fish and
swordfish Lat 14-54 Long in sight

Friday May the 22nd 1847

The first of these 24 hours light wind
steering to the northward we howl
for a swordfish but did not get
him the middle steering 18-55 Long
the latter steering west saw
humpbacks Lat 15-47 Long in sight

Saturday May the 23rd 1847

The first of these 24 hours light
wind steering west the middle
light wind heading S W the latter
steering S W at 10 AM saw a
large school of whales as going quick
to the windward we howl

Sunday May the 24th 1847

The first of these 24 hours light wind at
1 PM the boats returned the latter
shot a black whale and they saw
that an iron broke and the other drove
by 4 PM we howl for blackfish got
them the middle heading to the N E
the latter light wind heading to the
N W the latter repairing a boat
saw in sight
