Sunday August 30th 1835

P. M. Commences With light Winds & pleasant weather At 6³⁰ took in I. G. Sails, halled up the Courses & down the gib. have the M. J. Sail to the Mast about 8 miles of the land by I. of Gull Middle part fresh breezes & same showery At 8 P. M. Maud Sail, run in At 8 have the M. J. Sail to the Mast the Capt went Ashore & one Boater crew the Ship Reeper of Salem lighting of & on the Harbour like our selves at 12 the Boater crew came of Ends with fresh Winds from the W. W. & showery & plenty of fruit along side

Monday August 31

Commences With strong Winds showery & squally weather the Waist Boater crew went & shore on liberty & saw several of American Sailors there that had been left there by the Whail ships the town put me in of some old antine town that I have seen before at 6 P. M. went on board the Capt & all that were on shore by this time air negatables were on board & we were ready for sea again we sent all of the Oil on shore to W. off. sperm to send home & to fish oil about & enough to Recruit the ship so we hoist our Boat up our helm square our yards & let her run to sea With strong Winds & squally weather in Company with the ship Ends With fresh Winds & fine weather employed in Ships duty stowed the anchor & on Bunt the Chain

Tuesday Sept 1st 1835

Commences With steady breezes from the N. E. pleasant weather & passing Clouds at 4 P. M. Commences With the ship the Capt went on board & the Mait came on board of us & took tea about sunset they ex changed again to three laudul provisions & middle part strong winds & same showery Ends the same employed in ships Duty
