

Remarks On Board of the Ship Haugua 1835

I. W. Commences With fresh winds from the S.E. & passing clouds. Set of sails at 5. Saw 2 sail of the sea now middle part pleasant. Making about S.W. course at 6 a.m. Saw a brig of our larboard bow steering to the S.W. at 8 saw a 1st ship of a privateer at 11 spoke the brig sail from the South Coast of Africa for Soler. So ends these 24 hours with a fine & steady breeze from the S.E. & clear weather the watch employed in ships duty 1 man unable to do duty.

All these 24 hours fine & steady breezes S.E. & pleasant weather. Wind bearing seems to prosper with fine weather & fine breezes we are shipping along through it finely from S.E. 6 miles per hour at 8 P.M. we are about on the Equator. Now she jumps over the line & is making her way in a Southern latitude. Soon I am in hopes that the Haugua & all that is on board will be in a high South latitude enough to find a plenty of Whales. So ends these 24 hours the watch employed in ships duty & a good lookout kept from Mast head.
