Monday 28 th Day of September Latitude by Obs 5° 35' S	All these 24 hours strong S E trad winds passing Clouds & some Squally we have maid about S W & S courses with all necessary sail set at 8 A.M. anhent the mizen I. G. sail & sent it down to repair So ends these 24 hours strong breezes & passing Clouds the watch employed in ships duty	Saturday 30 th Day of October Latitude by Obs 13 56	All these 24 hours fine Steady breezes from S E to East & pleasant weather we are now shipping along slowly & smooth through smooth seas hoping soon to see where there is plenty of the fish the whale that were in search of the watch employed in ships duty they all do eat as grail slowance as ever I see a ships Company so we have all necessary sail set to good advantage
Tuesday 29 th of Sept Latitude by Obs 7° 00	P. M. Commences with strong winds & some squally at 3 saw a sail to of the weather, quater & saw breaches & spouts to the windward supposed them to be hump backs middle part passing Clouds Oct 6 A. M. saw a ship ahead at 9 thought by her manuevering that they saw whale sent our mizen I. G. sail anhent the fly till repaired it & sent it again Ends with Steady winds & fine weather the watch employed in ships duty onhent the I. G. sail repaired & sent it again	Sunday 31 st Day Latitude Obs 15° 00 S Longitude by Chronometer Obs 26° 24' = 30° W	P. M. Commences with light breezes from the S E & fine weather at 5 P. M. Lowerd away all 4 Boats & put on a practising Excursion the larboard boat abt put a little to the waist Boat the next middle part fine breeze & pleasant at 5 A. M. some squally & a little rain the rest part unsteady winds & mostly Cloudy Saw white water & some breaches off our weather Saw to far of to ascertain what they were we have maid a course from South to S W these 24 hours
Latitude by Obs 9° 00 Wednesday 30	All these 24 hours fresh S E traids passing Clouds & pleasant weather at 6 P. M. the ship ahead that was the day before we are making from S S W to S W 1/2 W Course with all necessary sail set So ends these 24 hours strong winds & good weather the watch employed in ships Duty	Monday 5 th Day of November Latitude Obs 16° 30 Longitude at 4.30 P. M. 27° 12' 30"	P. M. Commences with fresh breezes from the S E & some squall clouds middle part a steady breeze clear & pleasant weather with all necessary sail set Ends with the same the watch employed in ships duty.
1835 Thursday 1 st Day of November Latitude by Obs 10° 39'	All these 24 hours fresh S E traids passing Clouds & pleasant weather nothing special has occured lately all things seems to go on smooth & quietly all on board seem to enjoy themselves as well as can be expected at sea the watch employed in ships duty all can eat there allow	Tuesday 6 th Day Latitude by Obs 18° 05	Commences with light winds & pleasant weather middle part the same at 6 A. M. saw the spout of a finback sent down Mr. Mayah yard & fore & main royal mast the wind to the Eastward at 10 A.M. fore & m. shiping sail & m. & g. shunting sail So ends these 24 hours with light & Steady breeze from the S E Clear warm weather with all necessary sail set to the best advantage All hands & duty the watch employed in ships Duty
Friday 2 nd Latitude	P. M. Commences with strong winds & good weather at 4 saw breaches to the windward middle part fresh traids & pleasant Ends with light breezes & clear weather the watch employed in ships duty the Boat steers employed in grinding irons all hands eat about two lawrences
