Remarks On Board the Ship Thaugua October

Wednesday
7th Day of Oct
Latitude by Obs 18° 53' S
Longitude at 2 P.M. by Chronometer 27° 13' W
P.M. Commences with light & steady breezes from the N.E. Clear & warm weather Middle part the wind more to the North passing Clouds at 11 A.M. Saw 4 sail to the N of our lead water Ends with light breezes & warm the watch employed in Ship's Duty

Thursday
8th Day of Oct
Latitude by Obs 19° 47'
All these 24 hours light breezes from the N & W & passing clouds at 12 Middle part the wind halts some on the quarter blowing from 3 to 5 miles per hour with all sail set to good advantage. So Ends these 24 hours on board the Thaugua all hands well & happy & studying sail. Set lower & aloft the watch employed in Ship's duty light breezes from the west & clear weather

Friday 9th
Latitude by Obs 19° 55'
P.M. Commences with light breezes from the N.E. & pleasant weather at 2 light shower of rain the wind held to the South took in all standing sails & brail sharp up saw 4 sail to the windward Middle part clear & pleasant Ends with light breezes from the S.E. & fresh ship the sail proved to be a Breeze standing to the Eastward the watch employed in Ship's duty

Saturday
10th Day of Oct
Latitude by Obs 21° 09'
P.M. Commences with light breezes from the S.E. & pleasant weather at 6 a light shower of rain Middle part a steady breeze & passing clouds Ends with a fine breeze from the S.E. & pleasant the watch employed in Ship's duty with all necessary sail set

Sunday
11th Day
Latitude by Obs 22° 42'
Longitude at 2 P.M. by Chronometer 25° 08' 30"

The first part of these 24 hours light breezes from the S.E. & pleasant weather Middle part the wind stronger later part light & clear weather & a good look out ship & nothing seen of notice these 24 hours we all hands well on board of the good ship Thaugua & May God protect us through our voyage & safely return us to our place of residence set I. J. M. J. & Studingsdiss

Monday
12th Day
Latitude by Obs 24° 36'
Longitude at 4 P.M. by Chronometer 25° 14' 30"

Commences with light winds from the S.E. & pleasant weather at 1 saw a schooner to the windward running down before the wind at 5 saw a float of a pinback Middle part fresh breeze from the E & E & passing clouds we are flying along through it about 7 miles per hour So Ends these 24 hours all hands well on board & the watch employed in Ship's duty Saw a beach of our starboard bow & bore away for it

Tuesday 13th
Day of Oct
Latitude by Obs 26° 23'

All these 24 hours steady breezes from the N & E & good weather at 3 P.M. saw a school of hump backs & pinbacks whales & kept our course again at 12 sight of another float. So Ends these 24 hours with all sail set to good advantage & the watch employed in Ship's duty

Wednesday
14th Day
Latitude by Obs 28° 36'
Longitude

P.M. Commences with fine & steady breezes from the North & good weather Middle part fresh breezes breezes & Clouds at 6 A.M. sent the Topgallant boom & rigging & sail in on deck Look out for prisoners Commenced raining Ends with strong winds from the N.W. & passing clouds blowing about 9 perhaps with 12 miles per hour the watch employed in the
