Commences with light & steady breeze from the South & good weather one ship in sight ahead Coried sail all night Middle part & early calm & pleasant A beautiful moon to light us by night At 6 A.M. the day reveals calm & some Cloudy Ends with light winds & pleasant weather Standing to the westward all hands with on Board

Thursday
5th Dec
31 178

J. M. Commences with light winds from the South & pleasant weather at 6 P.M. Speed eight miles ahead of 5 toward every other boat & Chast. them till nearly dark till got nearly clear enough to begin manœuvring for us. Came on board shortland sail boat & headed to the westward at 6 P.M. wore ship. the wind light & pleasant at 6 & 8 M. lowered after whales with no success at 10 made whales 10 miles to the windward lowered all fore-boats & Chast. them, was playing round to either side & took up light air of wind. our boats about 4 or 5 miles to the windward chasing whales & back to the windward being in

Friday
6th.

F. M. Commenced with light air & wind from the South at 1 P. M. the Capt. passed to a large right whale the vessel took a blow & killed him in about 15 minutes all 4 boats sprung on to him at 8 got along side on fluke & fire Chaney & Got, Skinner at Lunsford had been cut in middle heart piece & fins from the OH M. & 2nd placement we cut started the big whale in the morning at 8 A. M. lowered board awast & saw about 100 dark-colored whales to a right whale run about 4 miles to the windward of the ship before he wrote to me Christ Henry & came up with our boat just as they killed him all 5 boats pulled him in to at 11 P. M. long side the ship put his

Monday

here 24 hours Commenced with fresh breezes from the S.W. & passing Clouds lowered several times after which with no success the whales were & the Sea raised at 10 P.M. Boats down all the boats went out at 10 P.M. Boats down the bows all the boats set out Strong winds & a little rain at 6 P.M. all hands left the boat out for. Stowing down at 11 lowered larboard & 12 boats with no success Strong winds good weather & raised the bows here 24 hours on board the ship Thorough Stowing Down a fair of cut about 160 lbs all hands that were able employed in said duty 3 or 4 cut snaped & will be had that they are of duty

Tuesday
10th day

These 24 hours Commenced with strong breezes from the S & W & good weather all hands except them that were at duty employed in stowing down Cargo at 6 to 8th all stowed & latches on & in for a light wash we are all dirty as ever I saw pigs & the cat & gurry on deck let's have a foot wash we sit our selves & set loads crew watches for the night at 5 to 8th pulled all hands & maid more sail so lands there 24 hours strong winds & brooding cloudes were unable to be seen

Wednesday
11th Day of November
Latitude 30° 57'

F. W. Commenced with fresh breezes from
the S.W. & good weather at 2 o'clock & boats
the larboard water pump & moved & almost to
the water's edge & could not get near away
again at 4.30 o'clock again with no success
at 5 o'clock I left & left the water as usual
till 6 o'clock & left with light breezes & came
aboard some of the men in light

westward carry sail all this night at 7 3 sail
and light to the windward there 24 hours & 20
miles from the S. & E. & good weather
as far as we can

the South & good weather at 2 PM. Sailed the English
A. range 500 lbs at 4 hours after to the
windward taking whale along side middle part
more moderate & cloudy under short sail at 5
At 10 AM. Sailed there 24 hours ends with
fresh winds & clearing weather all well on board
2 ships in sight
