Saturday 2 nd Day of January 1836 No observation	Now in The Indian Ocean Making our way to the Isle of Desolation & shortening sail nig All these 24 hours light winds from the South & passing Clouds with a little light rain on bent our foresail & repaired it	Thursday 7 th Day of January Latitude 38° 25' Longitude at 3 P. M. by Chron 53° 47' 45"	P. M. Commences with light breezes from the S. & E. & good weather bent the M. I. G. sail middle part light breezes from the East these 24 hours Ends with little winds from the N. E. & good weather on bent the G. I. to repair Course S. by E.
Sunday 3 rd Day of Janu Latitude Obs 38° 05' S Longitude by Chronom 49° 55' 45"	These 24 hours Commences with light breezes from the Eastward & Cloudy weather at 6 P. M. the wind shifted to the North middle part of fine breeze & passing Clouds later part strong breezes & some squalls these 24 hours kept away without seeing any whales of the right kind we carry sail all these 24 hours all hands that are well on board the Haugaa	Friday 8 th Day Latitude 42° 37'	P. M. Commences with light breezes from the N. E. & fine weather at 2 P. M. lowered after blackfish. Caught none Came on board bent the G. I. middle part strong winds from the N. E. & passing Clouds later part saw a plenty of finches Ends with fresh gails & some Cloudy
Monday 4 th Day No Observation Longitude by Chronom 49° 55' 45"	P. M. Commences with fresh breezes from the N. E. & some squalls at 4 the wind backed to the Westward & blowing heavy attended with rain Double reef tails at 6 P. M. fore & Mizen I. sails middle part the wind increasing took in G. I. & M. I. sail & have her to under Spencers later part set Double reef I. sail Ends with fresh gails & Cloudy weather	Saturday 9 th Day Latitude 42° 02' Longitude at 1 P. M. 57° 21' 30"	P. M. Commences with strong winds from the North & Cloudy weather at 5 P. M. the wind shifted. During the westward blown heavy attended with rain Clouds reft I. sails middle part more made sail the foresail these 24 hours Ends with strong winds from the West & good weather with Double reef & Courses Course S. by E.
Tuesday 5 th Day Latitude Obs 38° 29' South	P. M. Commences with fresh gails from the S. E. & Cloudy weather middle part more moderate set foresail at 1 P. M. set Double reef I. sails on bent the main I. sail to repair Ends with strong winds & thinly Cloudy all hands but 11 watch employed in repairing the M. I. sail	Sunday 10 th Day Latitude Obs 43° 54' South Longitude at	P. M. Commences with fine breezes from the West & good weather turned out all reefs & set M. I. G. sail middle part fresh breezes & Cloudy weather later part strong winds from the N. E. & passing Clouds sent down Mizen I. G. mast so Ends these 24 hours On board the Haugaa whilst sliding along ore the South I. saw at the rate of 8 or 9 miles per hour the Isle of Desolation for to make & that I hope soon will show her & am to anchor in some Bay safe Bay there to fill our ship up with out delay & then so quickly come away & safely return to our friends again with love & splendor & not with decay
Wednesday 6 th Day Latitude Obs 38° 06' Longitude 55° 17' 45"	P. M. Commences with fresh gails & Cloudy weather later part light winds from the South & good weather bent the M. I. sail & on bent the main I. sail Carried sail all these 24 hours the watch employed in repairing sails & a good lookout kept from the Masthead Looking to see soon that looks like whale
