Desolation Towards the isle of Madagascar on the
Whaling ground. Tuesday 23rd Day of February 1836

All these 24 hours fresh gails from the S.W. & squally
weather all these 24 hours Bailing & a rough sea on
under cloast reefs {56° 57' 30"}
Latitude 35° 31' Course Stead N.W. Longitude at 10 P.M.

Wednesday 24th Day

P.M. Commences with strong gails from the S.W.
& passing clouds At 4 P.M. Coold down the works Middle part
more moderate under double reefs these 24 hours ends with light winds
from the South & good weather all hands employed in stopping
Down in the after hole Latitude By Obs 34° 11' S Course Stead

Thursday 25th

All these 24 hours light & hapling winds & good weather
At 4 P.M. finished Stowing down 82 & 6 bbls of Sperm Oil
At 12 Meridian Calm Clear & warm weather the watch employed
in Ships Duty & a good lookout kept from masts
Latitude 33° 55' Longitude at 4 P.M. 54° 16' Course S.W. by E

Friday 26th Day

The first part of these 24 hours Calm & fine weather
middle & later part fresh breezes from the N.E.
& same cloudy the watch employed in Ships Duty
Course Stead N.W. by N Latitude Obs 33° 42' At 4 P.M. took
A Lunar Observation by measuring the Distance from the
sun to the moon longitude by Lumar

Saturday 27th

All these 24 hours strong winds & good weather
later part under double reefs the watch employed in
Ships Duty all hands well on board & in good spirits but
a Canacher that I have formerly mentioned of & I am
affraid that he want ever give any better
Latitude By obs 35° 00' Longitude at 2 P.M. By Chronometer 52° 38' 30"

Sunday 28th Day of February Continued
The first part of these 24 hours fresh winds
from the N.E. & good weather later part light
winds from the South & heavy rain latitude
Longitude at 2 P.M. 51° 26'

Monday 29th

All these 24 hours light winds from the South
& West & cloudy weather the watch employed in
Ships Duty after 12 middle part rainy weather No observation

Tuesday 1st Day of March 1836

P.M. Commences with light breezes from the West
& cloudy weather Middle part & later part fine breezes
& passing clouds the watch employed in cleaning
Ship & a good lookout at the Mast head latitude 31° 06'

Wednesday 2nd

All these 24 hours strong winds from the S.W. to S.E.
At 8 P.M. Shortened sail brist the yards & left to the
wind on the larboard tack at 5 P.M. made sail keep of
our Course N.W. by N. no whales seen these 24 hours the
watch employed in Ships duty latitude By Obs 30° 37'

Thursday 3rd Day

The first part of these 24 hours strong winds from
the S.E. & good weather later part squally & showery
& strong breezes from the E.S.E. Shortened sail &
laid trys for the night & stood Boats crews Course
later part N.W. by E latitude 29° 11' longitude at 3 P.M.
47° 23'

Friday 4th Day

all these 24 hours strong winds from the East &
squalls of rain have too at night & made sail in the
morning latitude By Obs 27° 51' South
Long at 2 P.M. 46° 44'
