

Remarks On Board The Ship Hauguia 1836

Wednesday 6th Day of April

The first part of these 24 hours fine breezes from the South & pleasant weather middle & later part strong winds & some cloudy weather At 5 P.M. the land in sight at 6 wore ship, shortened sail & stood off a great number of Wharves & Skipgacks all round the ship we caught as many as we wanted

Thursday 7th Day

All these 24 hours strong winds from the South with passing Clouds & over Casts at 4 Carried away the lee chace of the M. S. sail anhent it & bent the new fore topsail in its place first of the courses & fore topsail the land in sight at 4 P.M. headed of all night & in in the morning Ends with strong breezes under Double reefs & fore tack aboard
Lat $24^{\circ} 27'$ Long $43^{\circ} 45''$ at 3 P.M.

Friday 8th

The first part of these 24 hours strong gails from the South & passing Clouds later part light breezes clear & warm weather at 6 P.M. saw the Ship Golden Farmer Hunter & had a gam with her saw no whale
Latitude by Obs

Saturday 9th

The first part of these 24 hours light winds from the S.W. & pleasant weather the land in sight wore ship & stood off later part strong breezes & squally weather in Company with the Gold Hunter
Latitude at $24^{\circ} 44'S$

Cruising in The Mozambique Channel

Sunday 10th Day of April

All these 24 hours strong gails from the South & squally weather the 1st part later part good weather game with the Gold Hunter saw some Breaches disposed them to see gumbers under short sail the most of these 24 hours standing to the S.W. & S.E. Latitude

Monday 11th

The first part of these 24 hours strong winds from the South & passing Clouds later part light winds from the S.W. Clear & warm weather with all sail set & our Starboard tacks aboard all with our three watches employed in repairing the M. S. sail & other necessary work 43-15
Latitude $24^{\circ} 34'$ Longitude at 10 P.M. by Lunar $43^{\circ} 29' 45''$ by Obs

Tuesday 12th

The first part of these 24 hours light breezes from the S.W. Clear & warm weather anhent the M. S. sail to repair the Main with bent a new fore & Main topsail middle & later part fine breezes & warm steering to the S.W. later part saw several finbacks & a great number of small fish Latitude Obs. $24^{\circ} 19'$

Wednesday 13th

All these 24 hours fine & steady breezes from the South Clear & pleasant weather At 5 P.M. spoke the Ship Bayard of New York With 700 bbls of whale oil 8 months out from the Cape of Good Hope last bound in St Augustin Bay to Wood & water. So Ends these 24 hours on board the Hauguia the Watcher employed in Ships Duty steering to the South & West all day & laying to at night Latitude Obs. $23^{\circ} 17'$ South

Thursday 14th

All these 24 hours fine & steady breezes from the South Clear & pleasant weather steering to the S.W. nothing Discovered these 24 hours Notable a plenty of small fish along side & a plenty of Birds all hands well & three watches employed in Ships Duty Latitude $22^{\circ} 30'$ Long at 3 P.M. $41^{\circ} 14' 30''$
