

Remarks On Board The Ship Haugua Cruising 1836

Saturday 28th Day of May

all these 24 hours fine breezes from the South & good weather at 3 A.M. Could down the works so we pick up little by little. But a long space of time between these litters & have hard work for getting litters. But I am in hopes that we shall get it by good deals before many months shall close. So ends these 24 hours on Board the Ship Haugua with 40 blb of sperm oil turned upon Deck & 3 ships in sight latitude Obs 26° 27' longitude at 2 P.M. 37° 23'

Sunday 29th

the first part of these 24 hours light breezes from the South & pleasant weather spoke the Ship Gold Hunter later part fine breezes from the N.E. & fine weather two ships in sight standing to the N.W. latitude Obs 26° 44'

Monday 30th

P.M. Commences with fine breezes from the N.E. & good weather Middle & later part strong gails & passing Clouds later part slowed down our oil in the fore peak these 24 hours ends with strong gails from the North & good weather our ship lying under Double reef No. 1. Sail foresail fore Stairsail & Mizen & a bad sea on longitude at 2 P.M. 36° 54'

Tuesday 31st

P.M. Commences with strong gails at 8 P.M. more moderate the wind halled to the S.W. at 9 blowing heavy & the weather looking bad & sharp lightning took in the foresail & Cloast reef the M. Y. Sail later part more moderate set foresail Double reef No. 1. Sails & run to the north latitude 26° 56'

Wednesday 1st Day of June 1836

All these 24 hours strong gails from the S.W. & passing Clouds under short sail at 7 P.M. saw one sail off our lee quarter so ends these 24 hours strong gails a bad sea & aile larboard tack aboard latitude 26° 42' longitude at 2 P.M. 36° 56'

In The Moosembeke Channell June 1836

Thursday 2nd Day of June

P.M. Commences with strong breezes from the S.W. & passing Clouds Middle & later part light breezes & Calms ends with a light breeze from the N.E. Clear & pleasant weather with all sail set standing to the North latitude Obs 26° 54' at 4 P.M. 4 sail in sight at 3 P.M. one Do. latitude Obs

Friday 3rd

P.M. Commences with light breezes from the S.W. & fine weather Middle part heavy squalls from the North attended with rain sharp lightning & heavy thunder ends with strong gails from the S.W. & passing Clouds longitude at 2 P.M. 36° 34' 30'

Saturday 4th

All these 24 hours strong winds from the South first & later part good weather & passing Clouds Middle part squally under short sail & to rugid to whale latitude Obs 26° 02' S.

Sunday 5th

P.M. Commences with fresh breezes from the South & some light showers of rain Middle & later part light breezes & a heavy swell from the S.E. first part spoke the Ship Ocean of New Bedford Capt Bourne 700 blb right whale & 100 sperm oil latitude Obs 25° 37'

Monday 6th

P.M. Commences with fine breezes from the South & good weather later part fresh breezes from the South & passing Clouds saw two sail of our lee bow standing to the westward so ends these 24 hours with strong breezes under all sail standing to the Eastward first part in Company with the Schooner & the Barque Thetis Capt. Brewster 5 months out 130 blb of sperm oil latitude 26° 32'

latitude Obs 26° 32' Tuesday 7th

All these 24 hours strong gails from the South & passing Clouds later part under Double reefs & six sail in sight spoke the Barke raizer of New Bedford Capt. Dickerson 11 months out 700 blb Capt. Bennett was taken sick about 4 months ago & went on Board of a English ship of the Cape of Good Hope to go on to the Cape longitude at 2 P.M. 36° 53' 40'
