

Remarks On Board The Ship Haugua Lying

Friday 3rd Day of July

All this Day light breezes from its usual quarters & fine weather all hands employed in wooding & other necessary jobs on Board the Ship
Arrived English Barge Board

Saturday 9th

All this Day light breezes from its usual quarters & fine weather all hands employed in wooding & other sundary jobs Boated off 4 loads of wood

Sunday 10th

All this day the wind & weather as usual one half of the Ship's Company ashore on liberty & returned on Board at sunset

Monday 11th

All this Day the wind & weather as above mentioned all hands employed in Boating of wood Stowing it away & so on went ashore & got a bullash

Arrived Ship British Barge Reliance from London 8th months out brought news that the french had consented to pay the Debt to the americans

Tuesday 12th

All this Day & the first part of this Day light land breezes from the land & thick fog middle part Calm later part a fine Sea Breeze got of one raft of water Containing twenty three Cask & took hoisted it inn on deck

Wednesday 13th

All this day strong breezes from its usual quarters & good weather one watch employed in Stowing down wood & water & the Starboard watch ashore on liberty & returned at sunset
Arrived Barge Raigue

Thursday 14th

All this Day fine breezes from its usual quarters & fine weather the Lar Boated off four loads of wood in the morning the Starboard watch ashore on liberty the Starboard aboard employed in sundary jobs of ship's duty the liberty men return good time from the shore

Friday 15th Day of July

All this day strong land & Sea breezes & fine weather Boated off 4 loads of wood washed & painted one side of the Ship & the Starboard Watch on liberty
Arrived Ship Bangall of Salem with 900 bbls

Saturday 16th

All this day fresh breezes from its usual quarters & pleasant weather larboard watch ashore on liberty the Starboard on Board employed in sundary jobs of ship's duty

Sunday 17th

All this day light breezes from its usual quarters & fine weather one watch ashore on liberty

Monday 18th

All this day wind & weather as usual the larboard watch employed ashore on liberty & the Starboard employed in painting ship & other necessary jobs
Sailed Barge Reliance of London Bound to the West

Tuesday 19th

This day the wind light from its usual quarters & pleasant weather one watch ashore on liberty the other employed in sundary jobs went ashore & got a bulark & gaberdise bbls of sand Sailed Ship Gold Hunter the Commodore ship

Wednesday 20th

This day light land & Sea breezes & Calms Clear & pleasant weather one watch on liberty the other employed in sundary jobs on Board the Ship I had a opportunity to go down to Sunday Island & take a short view of it & the solid Coral reef that surrounds the island Arrived Ship Looan 8th of perm & 900 of whole oil Capt Washier gave a general invitation to all the Captains in the port to take supper on Board the Haugua & it was executed
At 8 P.M. a gun was fired from the Ship Emerald Capt Hartman & the Ensign & the Commodore's flag were hoisted
