

Remarks On Board The Ship Haugua
Wednesday 8th Day of February 1837

All these 24 hours light breezes from S.E. to E.S.E. & Clear weather At 4 P.M. took in light sails & hove the M. S. to the Mast at 5 P.M. Told away again & run in at 7 Came to anchor off James town on the Isle of St. Helena & was visited by the Health Officer & American Counselor we hoisted a white flag to the main to give notice that there was liberty to Board the Ship

Thursday 9th
All this Day lively breezes from the S.E. & fine weather later part commenced ~~unloading~~ painting the spars one watchman went ashore on liberty a good number of ships came in & some small boats this day including 36 hours a french schooner of war arrived

Friday 10th
All this Day fine S.E. traids & pleasant weather the larboard watch went ashore on duty and liberty the starboard watch on board employed in ships duty one spanned anchor was at two & two a good many ships arrived & sailed

Saturday 11th
All these 24 hours lively S.E. traids & fairing Clouds one watch ashore on liberty & the other employed in ships duty there is about 25 sail of ships in this port french Dutch American & English

Beighing In the Helena. C. P. Posner
Sunday 12th of January 1837

All these 24 hours lively breezes & pleasant weather one watch ashore on liberty. Arrived the ship Eagle of Wampanoag two brothers of the U.S. & a Sag Harbor ship all whalers the ship Phocion of New Bedford sailed for home full there is 15 whaler ships in this port

Monday 13th
All this Day fine traids winds & pleasant weather & several ships arrived & sailed one watch ashore on liberty the other aboard employed in ships duty

Tuesday 14th
All this Day fine S.E. traids & pleasant weather one watch ashore on liberty the starboard watch employed in ships duty & American whalers arrived & several sailed

Wednesday 15th
All this Day fine breezes & good weather the starboard watch on liberty the larboard watch employed in ships duty took in 90 lbs of water for to supply us to America blacked one side of the Bends & sundary other jobs several ships arrived & several sailed the ship Humboldt of Boston arrived from Manilla, laden with hemp & sugar bound to Boston

Thursday 16th
All this day strong traids & some squally one watch ashore on liberty. Several arrivals & clearances this Day

Friday 17th
All this Day strong traids & some squally with light showers of rain one watch on liberty the larboard watch employed in painting the outside of the ship S.E. sailed ship Triton & Parke raizer

Saturday 18th
All this Day lively breezes & some squally all hands employed in ships duty finished painting stowed down the water bent the sails & got ready for sea
