bread and our captin on shore lading on the spot of
the land and plenty of lades for his company
so ends this Day all ready for to go to sea but are
waiting for the King's Schooner

Friday July the 11 all of this day a strong gale from the south east and squally weather with some rain at 7 AM got under weigh and went to sea employed stowing anchors and chains this ends our stay at paradise a place for skippers and bad ladies not for good sailors our anchor is up and we are booming of into blue water at the rate of 7 knots an hour so ends this Day we left the bark united states in paradise

Saturday July the 12 all of this day strong gales from the South East. steering north by west under double reefed topsails and a heavy sea running employed braking out the after hole and stowing of slaps saw nothing but sky and water so ends this Day. Latitude 13.39 south

A.M. saw a spout and wore ship and stood south
East 1 hour and then wore ship and stood south
west employed taking in some pumpkins from
