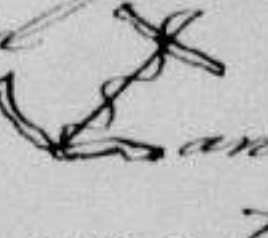
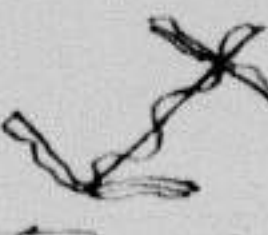
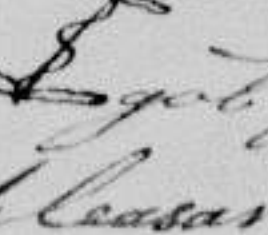


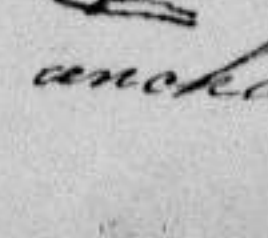
Bark Hope in the Indian Ocean 1851

Thursday November the 20 all of this day brisk breezes and squally with some rain. The starboard watch gave a chase on liberty and the larboard watch on board employed stowing down water in the fore hole and several other jobs to numerous to mention so ends this Day all safe in the heavenly land 

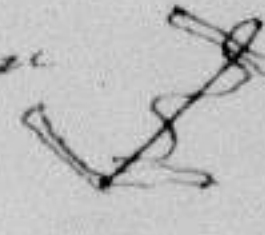
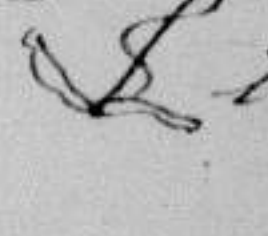
Friday November the 21 all of this day fine weather and the larboard watch on shore on liberty and the starboard watch employed painting ship and one boat crew waiting on the shippen and black gents over to St Ann's Bay so ends this Day 

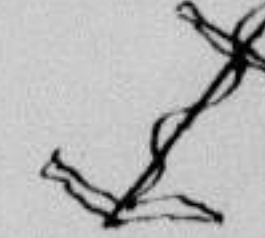
Saturday November the 22 all of this day pleasant weather and the starboard watch on shore on liberty and the larboard watch employed painting ship and beating the captain and some black gents and small stones round to St Ann's Bay where they are going to have a ball to night nobility and black Gents small trash cant attend but all the old habits will be present so ends this Day 
and the paradise birds that have 

Sunday November the 23 all of this day pleasant weather and the larboard watch on shore on liberty at 3 PM the bark united states arrived at the heavenly land captain pecking nothing more of consequence to day so ends this Day 

Monday November the 24 all of this day strong gales from the north west and rough weather with thunder and lightning and plenty of rain and the starboard watch on shore on liberty and the larboard watch on board employed stowing down water and took a small raft of casks on shore to fill with water at 3 PM let go the starboard anchor and at 5 PM sent down the fore and main top galant yards the captain came on board and some company with him and the captain of the states to and killed a hog so ends this Day 
with two anchors ahead hard times

Tuesday November the 25 all of this day strong breeze from the north west and squally with some rain and all on board employed at a little of every thing made a new fid for the main top galant mast and went on shore and filled five casks of water and broke out for flour and bread and tea and hams then at 5 1/2 P.M. hove up the starboard anchor and let it agane some fine apples came on board to day and some company from shore and captain pecking came on board to supper so ends this Day all hands on board with two anchors ahead and 40 fathoms of chain on the starboard anchor and 50 fathoms on the larboard anchor 
standing 4 watches to night 

Wednesday November the 26 all of this day strong breezes and pleasant weather the larboard watch on shore the starboard watch employed stowing of the fore hole at 3 PM the bark clairvoye touched ~~here~~ at paradise and landed a sick man so ends this Day 


Thursday November the 27 all of this day pleasant weather and the starboard watch on shore and the larboard employed at a little of every thing at 6 PM hove up the anchors and halled off from shore and let go agane and got up the big gun to fire the black ladies again when they go to the ball hall so ends this Day black ball to night 

Friday November the 28 all of this day fine pleasant weather and the larboard watch on shore and the starboard watch on board employed at ship duty ball at mondays to night so ends this Day 

Saturday November the 29 all of this day fine breeze from the north west and all hands on board employed at ship duty at 9 AM the bark united states went to sea at 3 PM the hope got under way and stood for sea in company with the united states steering north by east so ends our stay at paradise and so ends this Day along to god
