First Part. This day begins with heavy wind with
squalls at 5 P.M. Weather more moderate discovered a
small hawk in the horizon at 10 o'clock let out the reef on the
main top gallant sail. Latter Part fresh breeze from N.W.
striking. Flyed out fore top mast striking sail on the main
top gallant striking sail flyed all hand employed in ship
Duty so ended this 24 hours, Feb 28 29 Long

Commenced with strong breeze from the S W steering
S by E took in the Storing sails a heavy and running

sails set at 10 AM raining so En^d Lett Long

 set at 2 P.M. same up & finally took in the stirring
