

Remarks On Board Ship Howard W. Worth the 2^d

Saturday Commenced with moderate breeze from the S.W. and clear weather steering by the wind to the Southeast Middle Port the wind at 11 AM shifted to W by S latter the same wind at 1 PM shifted to West saw a bark ship steering S.W. by S. Lat. 36.47

Sunday First Breeze in 24 hours fresh breeze from West in 10 fathoms sounded got bottom in 25 fathoms of water saw a quantity of bubble Mid Port the wind at 11 AM shifted to S.W. by S latter Part light breeze steered S.W. all the steering sails set, Lat. 48.34 Long. 104.37

Monday Commenced with light wind from W by S the wind shifted to the S.W. by S latter strong and clear weather the fore and main top sails reefed the mainmast took in the fore and main top sails reefed got bottom 65 fathoms red and black sand mixture of white Middle Port the wind at 11 AM shifted to S.W. by S latter strong breeze from W by S, Lat. 50.25

Tuesday First Breeze in 24 hours the wind West steered South clear weather and fresh breeze at 6 AM took in the fore top mast steering sail latter Part fresh breeze from S.W. by S sent down the main top sail on land West, Lat. 52.38

Wednesday First Breeze strong wind from S.W. the weather very smooth steering S.W. by S sent down the fore top sail on land West, Lat. 54.36 Double reefed the top sails at 3 PM saw the North Star and Cape Horn of Staten Island bearing strong S.W. by S and raining headed off shore to the Eastward this day the 11th

Master Bound to the Pacific Ocean

Thursday Commenced with a strong gale from the Southeast steered to the W by S the fore and main top sails Middle Port strong gale from W by S latter the same gale from S.W. by S latter land in sight bearing W by S latter steered to the South, Lat. 54.36 this day

Friday This 24 hours strong gale from the Southeast steered to the South under close reefed top main top sail at 8 AM fore sail and stay sails, raising Middle Port a heavy gale blowing on land away the fore boom likewise store the fore channel likewise the hulls and other damages, latter began to moderate over ship head up W by S ends this troublesome day, Lat. 54.36

Saturday First Breeze more moderate set the fore and main top sails close reefed and main top sail headed up W by S Middle Port light wind latter Part light air and calm at 3 PM saw Staten Land bearing from W by S to W by S employed in fitting a fore boom and rigging it out saw right and fin back whales, Lat. 54.36

Sunday First Breeze calm all hands employed in ship duty the land in sight Middle Port light air from S.W. by S the steering sails steered S.W. by S latter light breeze from S.W. by S, Lat. 55.37 Long. 104.19 West

Monday First Breeze in 24 hours, light breeze from W by S steered to the Westward bearing a fresh breeze, steering S.W. by S Middle Port the wind light from the S.W. by S latter fresh breeze at 10 PM tacked ship head up the fore boom in sight so ends this day, Lat. 55.36 Long.
