

Remarks On Board Ship Concord Jan the 1839

Monday Jan the 13
N^o 96 Commenced with light breezes from S W
stearing N W with all the stearing sails set.
got the spirit sail yard & cross employed
in fitting the boat. Wind and latter part
light, wind and calm. Lat. 44. 43. Long 79. 20

Tuesday Jan the 14
N^o 97 First part light air from the western steering.
W. W. Wind. Latter part light air
sent up the fore and Mizzen top gallant masts
and fore poles, Lat. 43. 50. Long

Wednesday Jan the 15
N^o 98 First part light air from the western
got out the flying jib boom and the sail.
Wind and latter part light air from S W
stearing N. sent down the main top gallant
mast sent up another, Lat. 43. 14

Thursday Jan the 16
N^o 99 This 24 hours commenced with light wind
from S W steering N by E, sent up the fore
and Mizzen top gallant yards, Wind
and latter part light air from S W
in weighing out in the main hold, Lat. 43. 50, Long 75. 14

Friday Jan the 17
N^o 100 First part light wind from S W steering N by E
saw first blackfish and porpoise. Wind
the same latter light wind from S W
stearing N. at 4. M. saw land, started the
anchors got them over the board Lat. 40. 14
Long 75. 37

Saturday Jan the 18
N^o 101 First part light wind from the western
stearing N by E. W. saw blackfish. Latter part
strong wind from the South all hands employed
in ship. Latter commenced steering Northward
Lat. 37. 43
40. 41
2. 58

Pacific Ocean W. W. Jan the 25 Winter Jan 1839

Sunday Jan the 19
N^o 102 This 24 hours commenced with strong wind from
the South steering N. saw a white whale
all hands employed in ship. Latter part
strong wind. Latter part strong N. W. Steering
fresh look in the lower stearing sail, Lat. 34. 42

Monday Jan the 20
N^o 103 Commenced with fresh breeze from South steering
N by E the water a muddy green. Wind
light at 10 P. M. saw land. Latter part light breeze
and calm steering N by E in shore, Lat. 43. 44 Long 71. 30. 15

Tuesday Jan the 21
N^o 104 First part light wind hauled off shore, saw a
great many humpbacks. Latter part strong
wind from the Northward taking off and on
shore were being to the N. saw a schooner likewise
wright whale, Lat. 33. 20 Long

Wednesday Jan the 22
N^o 105 First part moderate wind from N W
saw the schooner. Latter part moderate
saw a ship called the Steamer Jan of Boston
Wind and latter part moderate breeze from
N. saw humpbacks and porpoises so did this day
Lat. 33. 03 Long

Thursday Jan the 23
N^o 106 Commenced with moderate wind from the North
steering to the Northward and humpbacks
Wind and latter light wind and blowing saw 4
sail hauled in for the land. Lat. 33. 03

Friday Jan the 24
N^o 107 First part light wind steering in for the land
at 5 P. M. saw a bark off Valparaiso harbor the
light bearing 8 by 10 distant 4 leagues. Wind
latter light wind standing off and on the boat on shore
at 12 P. M. the bark came off with the recruits
