Saturday light air and calm strong breeze  
 Sunday 8 setting to the S.W. working in light air  
 N<sup>o</sup> 239 Part of the Island latter Part  
 fresh wind from the Eastward the vision sight

Sunday The first Part fresh breeze from S.W. at 3 P.M.  
 Sunday 9 sent 2 Boats by shore on the S side of the Island  
 N<sup>o</sup> 240 fore top the breeze of 5, stood off shore  
 latter Part strong wind from the Southward  
 breeze of the East Part of 18 M. the land in sight

Monday Commences with fresh breeze from the south the  
 Sunday 10 this in sight, saw killing the land in sight  
 N<sup>o</sup> 241 latter Part strong wind

Tuesday strong wind from the southward breeze  
 Sunday 11 off and in shore saw black fish thick and  
 N<sup>o</sup> 242 squally weather at 5 P.M. took in the fore and  
 Mizzen top sails double reefed the Main  
 at 4 P.M. more moderate made sail set the top sails

Wednesday strong wind thick and rainy weather  
 Sunday 12 at 3 P.M. took in the fore and Mizzen top  
 N<sup>o</sup> 243 sails the wind at 11 saw the land bearing  
 W by S latter Part the wind increased the  
 fore and Mizzen top sails, raining

Thursday First Part the 24 however more moderate  
 Sunday 13 at 5 P.M. calm at 6 light air from the  
 N<sup>o</sup> 244 Northward attended with the rain  
 latter Part strong wind and squalls  
 of rain the wind light from the  
 south a heavy swell on

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Friday Commences with light wind and thick  
 Sunday 14 rainy weather at 6 P.M. squally took in the  
 N<sup>o</sup> 245 fore and Mizzen top sails latter Part heavy  
 weather with a strong breeze set the top  
 sails double reefed taking to the East and West  
 the wind southerly no land in sight

Saturday First Part the wind light a little haze  
 Sunday 15 the wind moderate from the South  
 N<sup>o</sup> 246 saw black fish latter Part strong wind  
 and rain, headed to the Westward, Feb 26. 59

Sunday Blowing a moderate Gale the fore and Mizzen  
 Sunday 16 top sails furled the air quite clear and  
 N<sup>o</sup> 247 to the Westward latter Part heavy squalls  
 of rain took to the East

Monday Commences with strong wind and squalls  
 Sunday 17 from S.W. at 5 P.M. wore ship to the Westward  
 N<sup>o</sup> 248 the fore and Mizzen top sails furled  
 latter Part the wind set the top sails

Tuesday First Part Commences with fresh wind and squa  
 Sunday 18 ly took in the top sails headed to the Westward  
 N<sup>o</sup> 249 latter Part fine weather made all sail head up  
 W by S

Wednesday First Part fine weather at 1 P.M. saw the land  
 Sunday 19 at 4 saw whales breaved and got a topk head  
 N<sup>o</sup> 250 along side Mizzen latter Part light air latter the  
 same but in the whole at 10 P.M. saw whales  
 and struck one broad the head, the land  
 in sight
