Thursday This 24 hours fresh wind from the East.
July 28 finished stowing at 7 PM taking in the
N 279 fore and Mizzen top sails began to the South
Latter Part strong wind set the top sails
inful, Lat. 29.17 N Long 141.39 East

Friday This 24 hours strong wind from the Eastward
July 29 began to the N. W. Mizzen top sail at 6
N 280 PM took in the fore and Mizzen top sails
at 10 PM took to the South Latter Part
More moderate made sail Lat. 29.16 Long 140.34

Saturday First Part moderate wind repaid the
July 30 the top gallant sail at 2 PM saw 3 persons
N 281 took at 4 o'clock to the S. E. where we were
on the wind to the Southward Latter Part
the same, Lat. 28.45 Long

Sunday Commenced with strong wind from
July 31 the Eastward took to the Southward
N 282 under short sail Latter Part fine
weather made sail, Lat. 29.52 Long 140.578

Monday This day moderate wind wind from the
July 22 weather clearing but the wind to the North
N 283 saw 2 men, 2 women and a small child
to the North of it. Latter Part stored off South
at sail set Lat. Long

Tuesday First Part fresh wind from the Eastward
July 23 stored South at 6 PM shortened sail by the
N 284 wind Latter Part fine weather saw nothing
Lat. Long

Wednesday Commenced with fine weather clearing
July 24 to the Westward at 4 PM began by the
N 285 wind to the N. E. at sail set Latter Part
the same Lat. 29.27 Long 141.068

Thursday This 24 hours moderate wind from
July 25 S. E. began to the S. E. which was Latter Part
N 286 the same saw five backs, Lat. 31.07 Long 141.32

Friday Commenced with fine weather at 4 PM saw
July 26 a school of whales conversed a mile off Latter Part
N 287 but wind blowing strong in night of rain
fore and Mizzen top sails furled ahead to the
Southward, Lat. 31.14 Long 141.16 East

Saturday This 24 hours set in with strong wind and
July 27 especially boiling rough headed to the
N 288 S. E. Latter Part finished in rain at 4 PM -
blowing a gale with squalls of rain

Sunday First Part 24 hours blowing hard abeam
July 28 scattered wind to the Southward the East
N 289 a school of whales spotted all around the
Ship too late to lower Latter Part saw
them again lowered and got 1, but him in

Monday First Part strong wind began to feel saw
July 29 breacher Latter Part more moderate at 4 PM
N 290 finished looking fine weather, Lat. 31.37 Long 141.58

Tuesday Commenced with fine wind and weather clearing
