

Remarks On board Ship Howard Sept. 1839

Tuesday
 Sept. 27
 N° 330

Storm, from these 24 hours commences
 with strong wind and squalls
 strong by the wind to the SE at 6 PM
 took in the fore and mizzen top sails
 Breeze and Tally Bar. Blowing strong in
 squalls attended with rain from SE at
 8 PM at the fore and mizzen top sails
 close reefed; Lat. 28.39 N... Long 161. 23 East.

Sunday Sept. 2nd. Part. Strong wind and squalls of rain
with the 8 which well, a rain at 5 PM. worship to the
N^o 331. The rain in the Part blowing a gale in
squalls, then with rain, Sat. 29. 18

Monday First. With three 4th class schooners steamed
Sept. 1st. 1882. with signals of rain from 8th to
11th 332 at 5 P.M. with high sea up to 8th which
subsided at 11 P.M. commenced hot
blowing a heavy gale from E. S. attended
with high seas in the fore and main
topsails and foremast up to 2nd 332 the wind
headed to the S. W. took in the main
topsail a tremendous sea making
split the main topsail at 4 P.M.
began to moderate at 8 started off E. by S
under a close reef fore topsail.
Lat. 29.31

Tuesday Sept. 19th. More moderate made sail
 at 4 P.M. went to the main topsail
 at 333 kept another Middle Part steady
 wind from N. E. steering E by N. and increasing
 sail topsails. Left Port at 11 AM moderate
 and bore to the Eastward, Feb. 29-57, Log 164-52

In the Japan Sea bound to Hartward Island

Wednes³ First Part then follows commences with
 Sept. the 11 Moderate wind & squalls & stormy & high
 1834 all said sat. Much and latter Part fine
 weather strong by the wind & squalls & by high
 Sat. 30.01 — Low 186.46 East.

Thursday First. Part. commenced with fine breeze
Sept. 12 from the S. E. turning to the wind to the
W 334 East. wave sent out the fly jib boom
and set the sail at 4 AM gave a ship
standing to the S W. latter Part. fine
weather at 4 PM gave the ship 6 fathoms
and then a breeze 2 fms. when
to my 167 - - - -

Sept. 13
1835
Commenced in the forenoon and under the
favorable breeze & in company standing
to the southward, at 9 P.M. stood off by the
latter Part strong wind from N.W. with
a heavy sea & a rising sun & a heavy lowered
and struck a whale, lat. by S. 30 " June 168

Saturday Commenced strong wind from N.W. by 6
Sept. the 14 the whale along side both him in which
N^o 336 Part. spraddle latter Part. blowing a gale
from S.W. by E. the fore and by 11 am
top sail & high saw the ship & showing
very hard Lat. Long

2d. 1st Part. Moderated away to a fine breeze
 of the 15th from which the gale being stopped by
 N^o 337 latter Part. a very high gale. the wind
 moderate finished boiling more sail
 Sat. 29. 20 Lane 171. 45
