Wednesday
Jan the 15 First Part. Wind 24 hours light wind
N 457 from the S.E. clouds visible in sailing
the main body Middle Part. Light wind
tacked to the Southward. Latter part weather
tacked to the N.W. Lat 2.15.8, Long 174.10 East

Thursday Commenced with fine wind and weather
the 16 headed to the N.W. saw fine back Middle
N 458 Part tacked to the S.E. Lat Long

Friday First Part. fresh wind from the S.E.
Jan the 17 headed to the Northward fine weather
N 459 Part tacked to the S.E. tacked again
Latter Part. strong wind and the ship will
employ in mending sail, Lat Long

Saturday Commenced with strong wind from
the 18 the Eastward headed to the S.E. under
N 460 single mast sail at 5 P.M. saw a ship
steering to the N.W. at 7 P.M. spoke the ship
The Horn of Thomas' people, tacked to the North
ward. Latter Part the same, Lat 3.38 Long 174.22

Sunday First Part. then 24 hours strong wind from
Jan the 19 N 461 at 8 P.M. tacked to the S.E. under
N 461 the fore top sail bent another tacked
headed to the Northward Lat 3.08 Long 174.26

Monday First Part. fresh wind and pleasant at noon
the 20 started off to the Westward at 7 P.M. luffed by the wind
N 462 to the N.W. at 4 P.M. saw hope Island bearing W by N
distant 10 leagues, Latter Part the same

Monday First Part. fresh breeze from the S.E. started
Jan the 21 N 463 at 5 P.M. spoke the ship Horn of Thomas' people
N 463 Caught a porpoise. Latter Part. tacked to the S.E.
at 10 tacked to the Southward, Lat 2.48 Long 176.17

Wednesday commenced with light wind and ship in sight at
Jan the 22 N 464 at 6 tacked to the Northward
N 464 Middle and Latter the same Long 176.08

Thursday commenced with fine wind and weather
the 23 at 4 P.M. tacked to the S.E. saw many fine back
N 465 Middle Part. light air inclined to calm. Latter
Part. a squall again a breeze from the S.E. steering
to the South and East Lat 5.48.8, Long 176.34

Friday First Part. squally attended with rain head
the 24 up S.E. and East the wind to the East tacked to the
N 466 North. Latter Part. strong wind and squally
tacked to the S.E. under short sail, Lat Long

Saturday commenced with strong wind and clear weather
Jan the 25 headed to the S.E. under short sail. Middle and
N 467 Latter Part. the same at Noon saw a ship
steering to the Northward Lat 6.35 Long 176.55

Sunday First Part. then 24 hours fresh wind from
the 26 the S.E. headed to the S.E. Latter Part. light
N 468 wind and pleasant saw porpoise Lat 2.36 Long 177.38

Monday commenced with light wind from the S.E. steering by
the 27 the wind to the East. Middle Part. the same
N 469 Latter Part. light wind from the S.E. tacked to the
N.W. Dull very dull time no whales to be seen
Lat
