

Remarks On Board July 1840 at South America

Thursday Commenced with a moderate Gale
July the 16 began the Eastward headed to the
N^o 640 Northward at 10 AM sent on Middle and
Latter Part. Moderate Main sail tacked
to the S. E. Lat 20 Long 144

Friday Commenced with strong wind from
the N. the Eastward headed to the S. E.
N^o 641 North sail Latter Part made sail
blowing a strong breeze. Lat 22 Long 144

Saturday First Part strong wind and clouds
July the 18 at 1 PM. Double reefed the fore and main
N^o 642 top sails furled the Mizzen the wind
increased to a gale took in the fore top sail
Latter Part close reefed the top sail a
strong breeze blowing heavy at times with
rain a sperm whale passed near the ship

Sunday First Part the 24 hours began to blow
the S. E. at 6 PM the wind began to
N^o 643 from the Southward a ship in sight
the weather clear in latter Part light
wind at 8 PM the wind increased I saw
under the top sail thick and cloudy

Monday Commenced with a gale from the
July the 20 at 8 AM close reefed the fore and main top
N^o 644 sails took in the Mizzen headed to
the S. E. at 9 AM took in the fore Latter
Part the wind moderate thick and cloudy
weather Lat 24-53 - Long 144 38
Put out a new Boat and the
Star quarter

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Tuesday First Part light wind from
July the 21 started at 6 AM headed to the
N^o 645 wind to the N. E. Middle and Latter
Part thick and foggy employed in
making a boat. Lat 30-03 Long 144 37

Wednesday First Part light wind from the
July the 22 Eastward blowing at 4 PM. Calm
N^o 646 Made on Latter Part light wind
blowing with light rain at 8 PM. Calm
at 10 PM the wind to the N. E. at 11 PM
Lat 30-44 Long 144 38

Thursday Commenced with light wind and
the 23rd clear weather sometimes remarkable
N^o 647 for this season at 10 AM to 11 AM
that indicates whales but birds there were
great numbers employed in making
the S. E. at 1 PM Latter Part light wind
from the Eastward started at 2 PM Lat 30-29 Long 144 30

Friday The first Part light wind and pleasant
July the 24 weather stopped blowing the wind from the
N^o 648 Eastward Middle and Latter Part the
same employed in making Boats, Lat 32-15-23

Saturday Commenced with light wind from the
July the 25 Eastward springing to the Northward
N^o 649 fine weather and no whales took in
the fore Boat put out the 6 oared Boat
tacked to the Southward Latter Part the
same Lat 31-13 Long 144 36
