

Leaving too in a gale of wind Aug - 1840
During the night. 24 hours commences
Aug the 6 with a fresh gale from the N.E. with
N 661 a high sea took in the Mizzen top sail
and fore top sail split the fore top the star sail
brought to the deck. Night. Part. the same took
in the fore top sail. Latter Part. a very heavy
sea took in the Fore and Main. Carried away
the fore mast near losing the Boat so ends
this tempestuous day also - the 11th day

During the night. 24 hours commences
Aug the 7 attended with rain and a tempestuous
N 662 sea took in the Main top sail, split the
the star sail. Latter Part. the same split the
fore. Spent the ship lying too under
long. Spent the morning much water down the
hatchways also - the 11th day

During the night. 24 hours commences
Aug the 8 attended with a high irregular sea
N 663 the wind from E. to E.S. headed to the
Southward. Latter Part. Moderate at 6
and wore ship head up. N 664 set the top
sails close reefed set the fore sail reefed with
a fore stay sail employed in repairing
damages, Lat. 36. 15 Long 143. 43

During the night. 24 hours commences
Aug the 9 breeze to the N.E. under close reefed
N 664 at 1 P.M. the top sails were reefed at the job
and Mizzen a very high sea. With Part
squalls of rain. Latter Part. strong wind
and blue weather. Lat. 31. 38 - Long 14

Brought to the Eastward Aug the 10 1840

During the night. 24 hours commences
Aug the 10 blue weather breeze to the N.E. under
N 665 Double reef top with canvas. The Mizzen
top sail torn. another at 6 P.M. took to the
Southward. Latter Part. the fresh wind and roused
and a ship took to the N.E. part out the West.
Boat employed in mending the others
Lat. 31 29 Long 144 - 15

During the night. 24 hours commences
Aug the 11 at 5 P.M. spoke the Lightship of Linn. and
N 666 breeze to the Southward the wind to the
Eastward. Mizzen Part. the wind moderate
from the Northward. Latter Part. the
same moderate. the fore sail and Main
sails torn. the others, Lat. 30 - 57 Long

During the night. 24 hours commences
Aug the 12 the weather the Lightship in company
N 667 at 1 P.M. saw a school of whales. One
and struck a boat. the whale was
upside at 2 P.M. started off by 4. Latter
Part. strong wind and squalls of rain
Lat. 31 06 Long 147. 10

During the night. 24 hours commences
Aug the 13 the weather the Lightship in company
N 668 small Mist. Part. the same. Latter Part
light wind from the N.E. Lat

During the night. 24 hours commences
Aug the 14 light breeze from the N.E.
N 669 the wind from the N.E. breeze from the N.E.
Latter Part. breeze from the N.E. to the
Eastward. took to the Southward
