Monday Moderate wind and hazy weather
 Deth 21 the D. W. in sight Middle and Latter
 N° 797 Part the wind from N.E. steered N.W.
 employed in stowing oil, Lat. 4.03, Long 174.34 East

Tuesday bore with light wind from N.E. steered
 the 22 West, finished stowing Middle and Latter
 N° 798 Part steered N.W. the E.S.E. in venting
 the oil barrels and sent it again Lat. 4.55, Long 177.45 E
