

Remarks on board Ship Howard 1841

Thursday These 24 hours commenced with a fresh breeze from the NW steering East at the N^o 869 lower steering sail Middle Part the wind NW latter, West a high sea Lat 49.05 Long

Friday commenced with a moderate breeze from West the 2nd steering East the weather moderately cool N^o 870 Middle and latter Part light as to the wind hauled to the Eastward Lat 49.12 Long 118.54

Saturday First Part the wind light from ESE hauled to the SE latter Part the wind light from the Northward lower East Lat 49.52 Long 117.34

Sunday commenced with a light breeze from NW the 7th steering East Middle and latter Part light air N^o 872 and calm Lat 49.53 Long

Monday These 24 hours commenced with light air the 8th from the NW Middle and latter Part light N^o 873 wind from NW steering East Lat 50.09 Long

Tuesday First Part light wind and foggy from West the 9th steering East Middle Part calm latter Part light wind from the Eastward & hauled to the Southward Lat 50.14 Long 118.04

Wednesday First Part light wind from NW by E the 10th lower E by S hauled to the Eastward N^o 875 Middle Part the wind light from the Northward latter from NW blowing lower East by compass caught 2 porpoises

Bound to Nantucket with a cargo of sperm oil to S & S Huzzey March 1841

Thursday First Part light wind and variable weather from NW to W by S cloudy latter Part N^o 876 a fine breeze from NW steering E by S Lat 51.15

Friday First Part strong wind from NW by W at the 12th changed the W sail took in the steering sail N^o 877 lower E by S Middle Part squally attended with rain latter the wind from West foggy steering East made all sail Lat 52.22 Long 105.25

Saturday First commenced with a moderate breeze the 13th from NW by E lower East Middle Part the N^o 878 wind from NW to N light latter from NW to N a fresh breeze thick weather Part

Sunday commenced with a fresh breeze from NW the 14th steering East cloudy Middle and latter Part N^o 879 the same some blackfish Lat 54.03 Long

Monday These 24 hours commenced with a fine breeze the 15th from NW steering East fine weather Middle N^o 880 and latter Part light air and calm thick and cloudy at the E a fresh breeze from the West took in the E

Tuesday the first Part commenced blowing a gale from the 16th the E got the ship under fore and main sail some N^o 881 hail rain and snow latter Part at 3 and 4 o'clock began to moderate at the fore and main topsails let out some reefs the wind southerly by compass steered E by S at 10 o'clock made all sail the 18th this day
