 Monday The first Part a fine breeze attended with
 March 23 smalls of snow a ship in sight a head
 N 888 steering S by W the wind West all the steering
 sail set. Middle Part the wind light and
 huffling from S by E to W and snow latter
 a strong breeze from S by E steering S by W the
 weather clear growing up with the ship part
 set the top mast steering sail, Lat 57.15 Long 68.08
 Tuesday First Part a strong breeze from S by E all sail
 the 24 set that with drew the center of a greenish
 N 889 lost at 6 PM steered S by E at 9 the wind S light
 moving latter Part strong wind from S at
 5 PM 2 ships in sight a merchant ship off the
 low water a whale ship ahead Lat 56.41 Long 63.33
 Wednesday There 24 hours commences with a fine
 the 25 breeze from W steering S by E all sail set 2
 N 890 ships in sight Middle Part the wind from
 N 88 W latter Part the wind from N thick
 and rainy blowing strong in squalls raised
 the top sails to color the gill and main sail
 Friday The first Part commences with a gale from
 the 26 the weather attended with rain these squalls
 N 891 the top sails were ship to the weather at 8 PM
 nearly hauled at 11 hauled S by E and main sail at
 5 PM took again a head of S by W the gill split
 employed in mending it. N 892 this day
 Saturday commences with a breeze from W steered S
 the 27 at 3 PM the wind S by W steered S by E set the
 N 892 steering sails, hauled the gill at 6 the wind S by W
 took in the steering sail latter Part squalls
 Lat 55.15 Long 71.52

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
