

Remarks on Board Ship *Albatross* 1841 March

Supplies These 24 hours commenced with the wind
March 28 from NW and squally with hail. Middle
the 28 Part the wind light from NW and east. Latter Part
N 893 Strong wind from NW thick and cloudy steering
NW and all sail at 10 AM the wind increased to blow
the steering sails squally, Lat. 54. Long

Monday commenced with strong wind attended with
the 29 squalls from NW and the fore and Mizzen
N 894 the sails steering NW and Middle Part the wind went
Latter Part thick weather the wind NW and
moderate, sea, dark green water, Lat. Long

Tuesday These 24 hours commenced with a moderate
the 30 breeze from the NW steering by the wind to the
N 895 Northward thick and wet weather Middle Part
the wind NW and the top mast steering sail and main
sails stored. Latter Part fine and pleasant weather
the wind down the Lat. 48. 47 Long 952.33 west.

Wednesday commenced with strong wind from NW
the 31 steering NW and at 2 PM took in the lower
N 896 steering sail at 3 took in the top mast and top
gallant steering sails. At noon the wind at 2 PM the
wind NW thick and squally took in the 16 top gal
sail double reefed the top sails, sent down the main
top gallant and green water, NW and thin, Day

Thursday These 24 hours commenced with strong wind from
April the 1 NW steering NW and thick and heavy weather till
N 897 at 10 AM sent up the 16 top gallant and
set the sail. Middle Part moderate wind from
NW and the lower steering sail. Latter Part from NW
at 10 the wind light from NW and the fore and
main sails, all hands employed in heaving out the
the hatchway Lat. 45. Long

Friday First Part These 24 hours commenced with
April the 2 light baffling wind from the Northward
N 898 Middle Part a fresh breeze from NW and the
NW and Latter Part the same set the top mast steering
sail at 1 PM the wind increased to blow
Lat. 44. 45 Long

Saturday commenced with a fresh breeze from NW
the 32 steering NW and sent up the main top gallant and
N 899 at 3 PM the wind NW and all sail set thick and cloudy
at 8 PM the wind light from NW at 2 PM light air
from NW at 5 light wind from NW. Cloudy weather
headed to the Eastward, Lat. Long

Sunday These 24 hours commenced with a moderate breeze
the 4 the Northward headed by the wind to the Eastward
N 900 Cloudy Middle Part a fresh breeze from NW and
Part a fresh breeze headed NW and green water yet
Lat. Long

Monday These 24 hours commenced with the wind from
the 5 NW and attended with squalls at 1 PM experienced
N 901 a heavy squall split the jib took in the
reefed the top sails and main sail at 2 PM moderate
steering wind from NW and all sail. Latter Part a
fresh breeze from NW squally Part a jib at 11 PM
a heavy squall double reefed the top sails Lat. 41. 40 inch

Tuesday commenced with a gale from NW attended with
the 6 heavy squalls of rain and hail took in the top sails
N 902 and fore sail 2 PM set the 16 top sail. Clouds parted
and four sails stored off NW and Middle Part set the
fore top sail. At noon a heavy sea the ship was pitching
well but making a considerable water in the hull
works after. Latter Part the wind much more squally
Lat. 39. 39 Long 97. 40
