The watch at work breaking out water and filling the tank and also breaking out between decks to see what we had and also getting the deck put on deck and laming it in its place. The captain at work planning down the fore royal yard - it being so large at Lunsby cleared up deck and got supper. so end. this day

the day commenced with light casting yms
from the southward, starting by the wind. the
watch at work looking over the spars lashed
to the rail and washing them. in the morn-
ing saw a school of porpoises and the second
mate struck two of them and about ten
o'clock saw a school of sperm whales
covered the boats and the mate struck a
small one and then the rest put to wind-
ward and the the other boats after
them but soon gave it up as
a bad job. we got the whale
along side and fluke chain on about two
o'clock and then got our dinners. after dinner
got up cutting gear and ran rim line and
then cleared away and got supper. at night
the watch at work tanning and cutting it
into horse pieces. so ends this day. observed
in sight a brig standing to the southward

ences 16th.

This day commences with light winds from the south. the ship being fair the watch at work clearing away the heads and beams of the cabin. about one o'clock light the fires and went to trying out the watch at work minding and washing the decks after sunset but the watches the landward first watch on deck so ends this day.

This day commenced with light fogging, with some rain. About six in the morning ranged whales and hauled the boats (the *John* and the *Robert*) we took three and got them side about and went

to cutting in ~~the~~ and got through

room. the boy works going all the time

with some rain and squalls. all hands at work
clearing away the racks and cutting them into
horse-pieces and also mincing and drying and
we got through cutting the heads and then wash-
ed off [redacted] about four
o'clock [redacted] raised it when
if the [redacted] 20 fms [redacted] 14 fms [redacted] up again
about a mile off U.S. [redacted] Saturday we lowered the boat

and the male and second male fastened and the third male fastened to the second male's whale skinning. It was a loose one and the fourth male fastened but drew. we got the whales along side and fluke chains on at six o'clock. we then double reefed the fore topsail and hauled aback and had no wind. the weather squally and rainy, and we was obliged to cut down the tops three times during the night. so ends this day and a grey day it has been.
