Saturday 11.

This day born with strong wind and squally at 2 P.M. we bent a new mainsail at 6 P.M. carried away the crooked yard for the topsail and sent down the yard on deck the masts and later strong winds at 2 P.M. saw a school of black fish so ends this 24 hours

Sunday 12.

This day born with strong wind and squalls the carpenter employed in fitting a new crooked yard the mill and later part the wind light and raining so ends this 24 hours lat 10.

Monday 13

This day born with light wind and over cast weather steering N.W. carrying all sail the mill and later part light winds and raining so ends this 24 hours lat 10.

Tuesday 14

Born with heavy rain and light winds steering N.W. at 6 P.M. the wind blowing fresh from N.E. at 8 back in the light sails we set the topsail blowing a gale at 11 saw land on the coast bearing N.W. by S distant 50 miles so ends this 24 hours lat 20 1/2 long 150

Wednesday 15

This day born with light & gail of wind steering N.W. at 4 P.M. saw mangle bearing S.W. by the vision 48 miles at 5 in the night hauled back the yards and laid till morning then squared away fore the the land at 11 cast anchor in the the harbor of mangle so ends this 24 hours

Thursday 16

This day born with fine weather lading in mangle at anchor all hands employed in washing ship and other goods the later part the water so ends this 24 hours

Friday 17

This days work born with breaking out pork and Beef and back them to shore the later part we bent a new main topsail and sent down the main to gaff sail and mended it the watch on liberty so ends this 24 hours

Saturday 18

This day born with light and fine weather mending sails and eating fresh Beef and sweet potatoes the later part the work painting ship and fitting the crooked yard so ends this 24 hours
