These days 2
 This day born with light
 winds and fair weather
 steering N. W. at 6 P.M. with
 home in sight of land the
 name of ^{Saint} ~~Joseph~~ in the place
 Ocean at 8 o'clock at 10 M. we
 took in the life sails and hove
 to back till day light and
 then squared ~~away~~ at 9 A.M.
 we saw a sail on our weather
 beam at 12 we hove about
 fore but so ends this 24 hours
 lat.

Wednesday

This Day came with strong
winds and fine weather.
steering W by N at 1 P.M spoke
~~Bahia~~ River it was the
Ship Orion & later at 5 P.M
we entered the straits
the middle and later part
the winds fresh so we
this 24 hours.

Thursday 4 ~~March~~

This Day came with brisk
winds and fine weather
at 11 half past 1 PM the
sloop haled a bark for us
and the captain of her came
on board of us fired 3 guns
there being 3 islands in sight
the later part the same
bark in sight at 2 PM the
captain went on board the
franchman to have it gone
so ends this 24 hours

Friday 5

This day came with light winds
and fine weather steering
at 6 the mail of the French
man went on board of his
own ship and our captors
came back & gain to his own
ship the middle part the
weather overcast and the
later part raining so winds

Saturday Oct 22 1897

This day born with light
winds and raining no land
in sight till day at 4 P.M.
we had back our main
yard and the capture of
the ship arose came on board
of us for a few minutes
at 2 P.M. we bent our small
chain on the ^{top} of had and
with a fore of going I shone
the midship ~~board~~ ^{the} wind
light at 5 A.M. the wind
commenced blowing a gale
of every five fathoms in all
sails & ships in sight blowing
a gale of wind and land
all round us so ends this 24
hours

Sunday 7

This Day born with a great deal of
wind blowing N^W & lashing
under close reefed main
top sail the sea rolling hear
the noise and later part
blowing heavy 5. two sails
in sight seen this 24 hours
