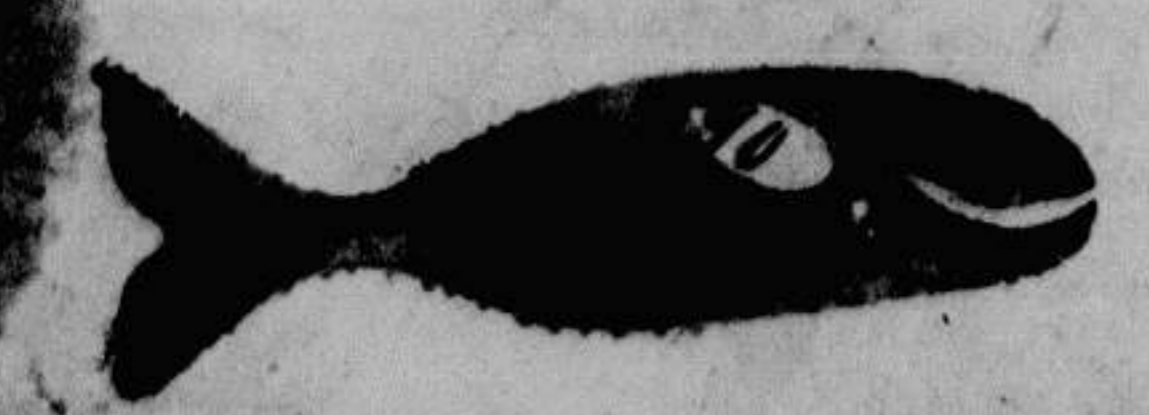


The Ship Hunteris  
part at 10 we got 2 whales  
a cow and calf got them in  
a long side at 11 o'clock  
so ends this 24 hours

<sup>the</sup> Tuesday 25  
This day born with strong  
winds and fog, all hands  
employed in heaving in  
the whale cable let the  
calf go it blowing a gale of  
wind we got the cow in  
at sun down the middle  
part it blowing a gale of  
wind the later part much  
the same so ends this 24 hours

Monday 26  
This day born with a gale  
of wind and ship in sight  
and whales all round  
us at 4 P.M. we shipped a  
new boat on the bow and  
the middle light winds at 7 o'clock  
commenced boiling & sail in  
sight so ends this 24 hours

Tuesday 27  
This day born with strong  
winds and clear weather  
at 6 P.M. we spoke the Lague  
North Star 1300 the middle  
part strong winds at 11 o'clock  
the mait got fatted and we  
bore a thin up so ends  
this 24 hours



leaving for the Great Sea  
Wednesday 28  
This day born with light  
winds and fine weather  
at 2 P.M. we got him at lar  
side and finished cutting  
in at 5 P.M. and then we  
commenced boiling again  
the middle part strong winds  
at the later part much the  
same so ends this 24 hours

Thursday 29  
This day born with strong  
winds and clear weather  
at 1 P.M. we spoke the  
Halo of Bear Reeford she  
wants four whales more  
& sail in sight the middle part  
strong winds and foggy weather  
all hands employed in boiling  
at the later part much the  
same so ends this 24 hours

Friday 30  
This day born with strong  
winds and foggy weather  
all hands employed in boiling  
the middle part foggy and strong  
winds the later part much the  
same so ends the 24 hours

Saturday July 1st 1845  
This day born with strong  
winds and clear weather  
steering E by N for the  
Great Sea at 6 P.M. we finished  
boiling starting quarters watch  
at day light we came very near  
missing a shore fire which  
longer would of done it so ends this
