Sunday

This day born with strong winds and fog when spoke the ship within 1/2 B. and the mile of B. standing the same as when was when was a having of the land and they are at 2 P.M. one of our men fell down the main deck way and when picked him up fore side the middle foggy and the later part light winds and clear weather so ends this 24 hours

Monday

This day born with light winds and clear weather all hands employed in stowing oil 2 ships in sight when finished stowing at 4 P.M. when are now laying of the gulf of tartre at the head of the sea with the wind a head and thick fog waiting to go the way at 10 P.M. when spoke the ship from of sag harbor course through the straits

So ends this 24 hours

Tuesday

This day born with light winds and fine weather large of the straits nothing much a wing I said in sight when are a gaming with the mile of New Bedford the day the middle and later part strong winds and foggy weather so ends this 24 hours

Wednesday

This day born with light winds and foggy weather at 3 P.M. when saw 3 ships keeping the fourth of July when had pleasure with and rest. By fore in view to day the middle and later part strong winds foggy and raining so ends this 24 hours

Thursday

This day born with light winds and foggy weather laying in the gulf of tartre waiting for clear weather to go through the straits the middle part strong winds and thick fog the later part light winds and fine weather 2 sails in so ends this 24 hours

Friday

This day born with light winds and fine weather 2 P.M. when spoke within of New Bedford the capt went on board and when had at the middle and later part it blowing 9 gail of wind at 5 P.M. when sent a fore topsail and sail in sight and laid on our weather so ends this 24 hours
