

Thursday the 31

This Day came with light winds and fine weather at 2 P.M. we got him ed. we pursued him up 9 miles on our way the beam and then we commenced towing him fore the ship with 4 Boats the wind light the ship made but little beating up to us at 8 P.M. we got him a long side of the ship and then took in sail fore the night the middle part the wind light and thick weather at 8 P.M. we commenced cutting at 12 we finished cutting so ends this 24 hours

September the 1st 1845

Friday the 1st
This Day came with strong and clear weather all hands employed in stowing down sail and hoisting 4 sail in sight at hoisting and whails all raised blowing us most out of the water the middle part it blowing 2 gail of wind all hands employed in stowing down sail and hoisting at the same time the latter part the weather much the same so ends this 24 hours

Saturday the 2
This Day came with strong winds and ruff the work much the same as the weather at 4 sail close to us sun weather became the middle and latter part strong winds and rain so ends this 24 hours

Sunday the 3

This Day came with light winds and fine weather and we some whails at 1 P.M. we spoke the Jappon of San tuckit 25th and oil not rising at 11 we finished hoisting the middle and latter part the wind light and foggy so ends this 24 hours

Monday the 4

This Day came with light winds and foggy at 2 P.M. we spoke the ship Lagoda of New Bedford and we got 2 casks of water of them and we sold them one cask of Bread at 2 P.M. we spoke the ship William Thompson of New Bedford hoisting 2 sail the middle and latter part the wind at blowing half 2 gail of wind and all hands employed in stowing down sail so ends this 24 hours

Tuesday the 5

This Day came with light winds and thick weather 4 sails in sight all hands stowing down sail at 6 P.M. we were down and spoke the ship Lagoda of New Bedford and part the time of day with them and went on at about 10 P.M. the middle and latter part the wind light and 2 casks off a chaise whail the ship Jany got a whail in sight of us and got him a long side and a frenchman got one in sight of us so ends this 24 hours

Stowing Down sail
