This day born with light winds and fine weather 4 sail in sight and of them a long line plenty of whails a round us at 10 o'clock the fourth mast struck and the third mast shot 2 lances in him and then the whail came up close to the boat and the parties her lance and the lance was got fast to the gun some how and at what ever time we lost the gun and the whail went out from him after dark so ends this 24 hours so at 11 o'clock

Monday 28

This day born with light winds and fine weather chasing whails all day 4 sail in sight and of them a boilling at 10 o'clock we run down and spoke the Gideon Howland of N B 20 shots out 1300 lb she had 8 just got three cutting in a whail so ends this 24 hours

Tuesday 29

This day born with light winds and fine weather no whails in sight to day at 10 o'clock we spoke the ship Chandler Price of New Bedford 8 shots out 1300 lb whail so ends this 24 hours at 11 o'clock

Wednesday 30

This day born with light winds and fine weather 8 o'clock we spoke whail there being very few whails to be seen to day 2 sail in sight and one whail seen so ends this 24 hours

Thursday 31

This day born with strong breezes and fine weather down and after whail plenty of them in sight 10 sail in sight and one of them whailing at 10 o'clock we spoke Chandler Price of N B 20 shots out 1300 lb whail so ends this 24 hours

April the first 1849 "1400 Whail

Sunday 1 no sail yet this season

This day born with strong winds and cloudy at 10 o'clock we toward again up whail and we made out as well as before with a wet ass and a hungry gut 4 sail in sight a boilling so ends this 24 hours

Monday 2

This day born with strong winds at 10 o'clock we spoke the ship Henry and Thomas of New London at 11 o'clock we spoke the ship Bregansy of New Bedford the captain sick no whails seen east blowing a gail of winds so ends this 24 hours

Tuesday 3

This day born with a heavy gail from the north one ship in sight the middle and latter part the same

so ends this 24 hours

Wednesday 4

This day born with strong breezes and fine weather at 10 o'clock the Captain went on board the Bregansy to see his Brother-in-law he was very sick he expected he would have to leave the ground and that account saw whails so ends this 24 hours

Thursday 5

This day born with light winds and fine weather toward for whails at 3 o'clock we spoke the ship out of N London and the ship of N B and we had 6 a gail so ends this 24 hours

Friday 6

This day born with light winds and fine weather all hands employed in chasing whails and that is our part of it to day 4 sail in sight and they doing the same so ends this 24 hours
