Tuesday the 1 1849

This day began with strong winds and clear weather at 8 P.M. we commenced stowing down oil at 8 o'clock we spoke the ship Tiger at steamington 11 o'clock out 500 Barrels W at 3 o'clock we raised a stink pot we lowered a boat and got 8 men out of him he was good for nothing he had been dead to long we finished stowing down at 4 o'clock so ends this 24 hours

Wednesday 2

This day began with light winds and fine weather nothing in sight and nothing to do day steering W so ends this 24 hours but some

Thursday 3

This day began with light winds and rainy weather the latter part good weather at 6 o'clock we spoke the S Henry Thompson one whail this season so ends this 24 hours

Friday 4

This day began with light winds and fine weather one sail in sight the latter part we saw whails and lowered after them at 2 saw one ship a balling so ends this 24 hours

Saturday 5

This day began with light winds and smoky weather toward after whails sent down the main top guller sail and mended it and bent it at 11 P.M. so ends this 24 hours

Sunday 6

This day began with light winds and fine weather a few whails in sight the latter part we saw a sail on our lee bow at sun down we hove to and took in sail so ends this 24 hours

Monday 7

This day began with light winds and fine weather at 8 P.M. we saw 2 whails and lowered after them 3 sail in sight at 4 o'clock we spoke the Tabacker Plant of P B 300 S 400 W 32 o'clock out and the Margrit of P B 150 o'clock out 230 W

Tuesday 8

This day began with strong winds and fine weather the water on plain in repairing the mainsail the latter we spoke the ship Gordon of P B 11 o'clock out 500 W and the Maryand Susan of P B 3 o'clock out 2 whail this season so ends this 24 hours

Wednesday 9

This day began with light winds and foggy weather 2 sails in sight this day all hands employed in mending sails at 4 o'clock our old Man went on board of the carison of P B for a game so ends this 24 hours

Thursday 10

This day began with light winds and fine weather at 10 P.M. we spoke the ship Rutusoff of P B at 2 o'clock we spoke the ship Superior of P B with 500 W 11 o'clock all hands a gaming a Bluing game so ends this 24 hours
