

The Ship Huntress 5 Days in the Chet Sea
Sunday 3

This day born with a gail of wind from the S.W. the middle and latter we shorted sail down to a close reefed main top sail the weather bad and raining so ends this 24 hours lat 54 21 N

Monday 4

This day born with light winds and a heavy snow storm the middle and latter part much the same so ends this 24 hours lat 54 21 N

Tuesday 5

This day born with light winds and fine weather nothing in sight and nothing a doing the middle and latter part much the same so ends this 24 hours lat 54 21 N

Wednesday 6

This day born with strong winds and thick weather at 7 o'clock we spoke ship Kar of New Bedford 12 shots out 20 Barrels Spinn in the Chet Sea up in 5 o'clock the capture came on board and we had a small game so ends this 24 hours lat 54 21 N

Thursday 7

This day born with light winds and fine weather all hands employed in ships duty at 10 o'clock the capture came on board the heavy to have a game the latter part we saw a lot of fish back whales so ends this 24 hours

Friday 8

This day born with light winds and fine weather at 2 o'clock we saw a ship a boilling at 5 o'clock we spoke her the ship Lha 22 shots out 2500 lb 4 steep le tops and 2 Regraps this season he wants 2 Whales more so ends this 24 hours lat 54 21 N

and saw the first bright in hail
Saturday 9

This day born with light winds and fine weather at 6 o'clock we spoke the Bragansy of N. Bedford all hands employed in ships duty we saw a great lot of ice on our weather bow and we run through a lot of it so ends this 24 hours lat 54 21 N

Sunday 10

This day born with light winds and fine weather at 8 o'clock we saw whales toward down and the main got past to a steep le top and we got him we got him a long side at 11 o'clock got dinner and went to work cutting him in got him in at 6 o'clock the Bragansy got 2 whales in sight of us 5 sail in sight so ends this 24 hours lat 54 21 N

Monday 11

This day born with light winds and fog at 1 sail in sight 2 a boilling and 2 a cutting the latter part of the day we spoke the ship Charles Price of N. Bedford 11 shots out 3000 lb so ends this 24 hours with ice in sight

Tuesday 12

This day born with light winds and fine weather 7 sail in sight 5 of them a boilling and we with the next the middle part fog at 5 o'clock we spoke the Bragansy of N. Bedford a boilling and the Charles of Fairhaven a the capture went on board a few minutes no whail this season 500 Barrels Spinn the latter part light winds and thick weather at 11 o'clock the sight we got our boilling so ends this 24 hours
