This day born with strong winds and clear weather & sail in sight one of them a boilling and we a long with her the middle and latter part thick fog and dam bad weather cold and disagreeable and a boilling at that so ends this 24 hours

Saturday 23

This day born with strong winds and thick fog verrey unpleasant for boilling at 2 o'clock the ship having part us could not lost reaft main top sail a boilling the middle and latter part much the same so ends this 24 hours

Sunday 24

This day born with light winds and fine weather and watch finished stowing off the fore hode at 2 o'clock we spoke the ship Bragansy of New Bedford the captain went on board at 5 o'clock we lowered after whales and they run in to the ice and we could not get them so ends this 24 hours

Monday 25

This day born with light winds and fine weather at day light we commenced breaking out the after hode at 11 we lowered down ward the mait got past and lost this line in the ice and the third mait struck and turned them up the second mait struck and turned them up we got one of them a long side at 3 o'clock and the other at 6 the Bragansy saw down and spoke us she got one whail 1 sail in sight and they all got a whail all hands turned in and the captain stood watch all night so ends this 24 hours

Tuesday 26

This day born with strong winds and fine weather at day light we commenced cutting we got them in and the decks cleared up at 4 o'clock got something to eat and then went to boilling & sail in sight and then cutting and boilling so ends this 24 hours

Wednesday 27

This day born with light winds and fine weather all hands employed in stowing down oil the middle and latter part much the same so ends this 24 hours

Thursday 28

This day born with light winds and fine weather all hands employed in stowing oil and stowing bread in a bulk out of the casks to have them to put oil in 12 ships in sight and 11 of them a boilling the middle and latter part much the same so ends this 24 hours

Friday 29

This day born with light winds and fine weather all hands employed in stowing oil and cooping and breaking out between decks 26 ships in sight and they all boilling and cutting the Barque Rickman fore hoded off one whail a long side and one on deck so ends this 24 hours

Saturday 30

This day born with light winds and fine weather all hands employed in stowing down oil the middle and latter part calm and fine weather 22 sail in sight at 8 o'clock we spoke the Governor Troop of N. B. so ends this 24 hours
