

July the 1 Sunday 1

This day born with light winds and fine weather all hands employed in stowing down sail at 10 o'clock we lowered down and the second main struck a steeple top we got him a long side at 4 o'clock so ends this 24 hours



Monday 2

This day born with light winds and fine weather all hands employed in cutting in we got him in at 10 o'clock the wind came better light winds and fine weather & sail in sight & a billowing and laid in sight ~~at 6~~ so ends this 24 hours at 5 o'clock

Tuesday 3

This day born with light winds and fine weather all hands employed in stowing down sail and billowing and setting up cast & sail in sight we saw one steeple top below and mist him land in sight distant forty miles so ends this 24 hours

Wednesday 4

This day born with light winds and fine weather all hands employed in billowing stowing down and chaising whails and setting up shanks piece of work on hand for a fourth of July 12 sail in sight some billowing and some cutting and some whailing laid in sight so ends this 24 hours at 5 o'clock

Thursday 5

This day born with strong winds and bad weather at 4 o'clock we shortened sail down to close reefed main topsail at 4 o'clock we got down billowing and cleaned up a little so ends this 24 hours

Friday 6

This day born with strong winds and fine weather all hands employed in stowing down sail at 10 o'clock we spoke the governor troop he came on board and got some rabbits of us at 3 o'clock we lowered down and the main struck a steeple top and his live partee and the whail whint of so ends this 24 hours lat. 54 o'clock

Saturday 7

This day born with light winds and fine weather all hands employed in stowing down sail & ships in sight and billowing at 5 o'clock we spoke Mocktesuma of A B 27 1/2 so ends this 24 hours latitude 54 o'clock

Sunday 8

This day born with strong winds and fine weather nothing doing to day garring with the Mocktesuma and the larant of Sagharber while we was garring the Mocks boats lowered down and struck a wright whail and lost him so ends this 24 hours

Monday 9

This day born with strong winds and thick weather all hands employed in cleaning down saw one wright whail and we lowered for him and that was over shair of him the middle and latter part much the same so ends this 24 hours 58 o'clock

Tuesday 10

This day born with light winds and thick weather all hands employed in cleaning down the middle and latter part the wind weather and work much the same at 2 o'clock we spoke the Mocktesuma of A B at 5 o'clock we spoke Carque Sheperdes so ends this 24 hours
