This day born with light winds and thick fog at 9 P.M. we spoke the Mocklesuma and the captain came on board the fog came on thick and we lost run of the ship and he had to stay on board of us all night so ends this 24 hours

Thursday 12th

This day born with light winds and thick fog at 11 P.M. we spoke the Mocklesuma and the govt. troops both of them the middle and latter part of the day the weather much the same thick fog and nothing else to be seen so ends this 24 hours

Friday 13th

This day born with light winds and fine weather all hands implor'd in chasing a-hail the fourth Mait struck and lost his line the whale ran away with him at 3 P.M. the Mait struck and his whale served him the same same so ends this 24 hours

Saturday 14th

This day born with light winds and fine weather at daylight we saw plenty of whale and lowered after them at 10 P.M. we spoke the ship Cabinat of St. Michael's 12 about 1100 Whail oil so ends this 24 hours

Sunday 15th

This day born with a moderate gail and thick fog at 1 P.M. we spoke the ship Bonanza of off B. 12 about 1200 Whail the weather much the same so ends this 24 hours

Monday 16th

This day born with a gail of wind and sail in sight the middle and latter part the wind and weather much the same both wind and rain with the ship have too under short sail so ends this 24 hours

Tuesday 17th

This day born with light winds and thick fog the latter part clear weather & sail in sight and land on our weather bow and a few whales in sight so ends this 24 hours

Wednesday 18th

This day born with strong winds and fine weather running in for the land at 3 P.M. we made the land looking for a-hail and found none this day 15 sail and one of the a-billing out of the 15 at 6 P.M. we spoke the Ramus of Westport 12 about 1100 Whail oil so ends this 24 hours

Thursday 19th

This day born with light winds and thick fog hanging with the fore yard a back in yelf whales a-blowing around us the mait lowered down after them in the fog and that was his part of the sea

so ends these 24 hours of observation to Day

Friday 20th

This day born with light winds and thick fog at 1 P.M. we spoke the ship Splendid of Goldspring 12 about 1100 Whail oil we lowered down after staple top whales and the mait of the splendid struck and they got him a long side at 10 at night so ends this 24 hours

Saturday 21st

This day born with light winds and fine weather at 8 P.M. we saw two whales we lowered down after them and the fog set in thick and we went on board at 6 P.M. we spoke the ship Bonanza of Westport 12 about 1100 Whail oil the ship Splendid in sight a-billing so ends this 24 hours
