

Sunday 23th

This day began with light winds and thick fog at 2 P.M. one of our men by the name of George a native of the Sandwich Islands at 4 P.M. the funeral was held over him and buried, so ends this 24 hours

Monday 24th

This day began with light winds and fine weather all hands employed in chasing whales at 4 P.M. the fourth whaler struck and we killed him we got him a long side at 6 and we hauled on and cut him in at 12 o'clock that night so ends this 24 hours lat 55.00

Tuesday 25th

This day began with light winds and thick fog the latter part of the day we saw a great many whales but they were wild at 6 P.M. we spoke the ship Splendid and the Rosinuous of Orestok both a whaling so ends this 24 hours lat 55.00 miles from land

Wednesday 26th

This day began with light winds and fine weather all hands employed in whaling and chasing whales the middle and latter part match the same so ends this 24 hours

Thursday 27th

This day began with strong winds and thick fog we finished whaling at 6 P.M. the middle and latter part it blowing a gale of wind the latter part we set a new pot in our works so ends this 24 hours

Friday 28th

This day began with strong winds and thick fog the middle and latter part match the same clearing home in quarter watches so ends this 24 hours

Ship Huntress

Saturday 29th

This day began with light winds and fine weather all hands employed in whaling and chasing whales at 4 P.M. we finished at 4 P.M. and then toward dawn two boats after a while 2 sail in sight close in to land so ends this 24 hours

Sunday 30th lat 55.32.0

This day began with light winds and fine weather the middle and latter part match the same 3 sail in sight 2 of them a little we saw one whaler all sail on the ship beating to the Southward so ends this 24 hours

Monday 31st

This day began with light winds and fine weather at 10 P.M. 2 boats went ashore and saw natives on the beach and got some fresh fish of them they appeared to be seals they had a large boat made of seal skins held up on the beach and turned over for there tent 2 men and one woman all dressed in seal skin close the land was dressed in man's apparel after dinner we spoke the ship Fox trap and Capt. Captains went ashore and they had left 2 sail in sight so ends this 24 hours

August 1849 Tuesday 1st

This day began with light winds and thick fog and rain the middle and latter part match the same clearing the 11th so ends this 24 hours lat 55.00

Wednesday 2nd

This day began with light winds and thick fog at 3 P.M. we toward dawn 2 boats and the wait got fast we got him a long side at 6 P.M. and cut him we got him at 11 at night so ends this 24 hours lat 55.00
