Wednesday 4th 1849

☞ banded with heavy gales from the Westward Middle and later Part More moderate Saw whales ~~could~~ went on and mist Lat. 39.05

☞ Thursday 5th lite breezes from the Westward Middle and later Part winds South spoke Ship Onton 10 whals. Merion clear Saw whals could not fasten Lat. 39.21 Long 136.22. so ends the day

☞ Friday 6th Lite breezes from the South Middle and later Part the same Saw whals load the boats and mist one so ends Lat. 39.18

☞ Saturday 7th lite ones from the South Middle and later Part fresh breezes Saw whals struck 2. (Drawn from One) but from the other on account of Fall line Lat. 39.22 Long 137.12

☞ Sunday 8th brisk breezes from the South Middle and later Part the same Saw whals could not fasten Lat. 39.33 Long 138.00

☞ Monday 9th calm. Middle and later Part strong gales from the N Saw whals could not fasten

☞ Tuesday 10th Strong breezes from the N. Middle and later Part the same Saw whals fastened to two drawn from both Land 30. miles Lat. about 39.00 so ends the day

Lapon Sea

☞ Tuesday 11th Lite breezes from the N.W.E. Middle and later Part Strong breezes and Rainy winds South Saw whals did not loam so ends the day

☞ Wednesday 12th Strong breezes from the South and Rainy Middle and later Part the same

☞ Thursday 13th Heavy gales from the North East Offshore and later Part the same

☞ Friday 13th Heavy gales from the North Middle and later Part More moderate Saw whals did not loam Lat. 38.55 Long 138.00

☞ Saturday 14th Strong gales from the N.W. Middle and later Part the same Lat 39.00 Saw whals did not loam

☞ Sunday 15th Strong gales from the N.W. Middle and later Part the same Saw whals could not fasten so ends Lat 39.11 Long 138.30

☞ Monday 16th Strong breezes from the N.W. Middle and later Part. Lite ones from the S.E. spoke Ship Lidin of Newcastle & Mersey. Part clear Saw whals got on so ends Lat. 39.40
